ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

An excellent $2\frac{1}{2}$ story Greek Revival sidehall house, of which numerous examples are concentrated on Mount Vernon Street. The Ebenezer Davis House has a full-width Doric portico, panelled corner pilasters, full-length window on the lower story of the facade and an entrance flanked by sidelights offset to the left.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

Ebenezer Davis was a marine inspector in Boston. His name appears next to a structure on or near this site on the 1852 Map of Somerville, which makes him one of the early members of the East Somerville community.
