#### I. General Information and Bid Submission Requirements

#### **Bid Delivery**

All bids must be delivered to City of Somerville, Purchasing Department, 93 Highland Avenue, Somerville, MA 02143.

Bids must be delivered by: 11:00 A.M. on Thursday, February 4, 2016. 1 copy of the bid should be submitted. Bids must be sealed and marked as follows:" Bid for HVAC Preventative Maintenance, Repairs and Controls for Municipal Buildings & Schools- IFB 16-58". All bids must include a non-collusion form, tax compliance certificate, bid pricing sheet, reference form as provided in this IFB, and 5% bid surety in the amount of 5% of the estimated contract amount. The estimated contract amount is \$2,800,000.00 A Bid bond, Certified Check, Treasurer's Check, or Cashier's Check made payable to the City must be submitted with each bid. Said bid guarantee will become the property of the City of Somerville if the proposal is accepted and the bidder either neglects or refuses to comply with the terms of the proposal. Bid guarantee will be returned within 30 days to all unsuccessful bidders.

#### **Bid Signature**

A bid must be signed as follows: 1) if the bidder is an individual, by her/him personally; 2) if the bidder is a partnership, by the name of the partnership, followed by the signature of each general partner; and 3) if the bidder is a corporation, by the authorized officer, whose signature must be attested to by the clerk/secretary of the corporation, and with the corporate seal affixed.

#### **Time for Bid Acceptance**

The contract will be awarded within 60 days after the bid opening. The time for award may be extended for up to 45 additional days by mutual agreement between the City of Somerville and the apparent lowest responsive and responsible bidder.

#### **Bonding Requirements**

Upon contract award, a <u>Performance Bond</u> and a <u>Payment Bond</u>, in the amount of <u>100% each of the total</u> contract price, will be required.

#### **Prevailing Wage Requirements**

Bidders will be required to comply with the Prevailing Wage Laws, M.G.L. c. 149. The applicable prevailing wage rates are attached. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in Articles of the General Conditions (included in the Contract) the City may, in its sole discretion withhold payment from the General Contractor with respect to a given application for payment unless the City has in its possession payroll records that are complete, accurate, and current as of the date of said application for payment. Payment by the City on one or more occasions in the absence of the General Contractor's compliance with this section shall not constitute a waiver of the City's right to withhold payment for noncompliance on other occasions. The General Contractor shall submit payroll information on a weekly basis in a format approved by the City (form attached) numbered in numerical sequence and signed by the Contractor (including forms: for weeks when the Contractor is not on the site, in which case there shall be a notation to the effect "no work this payroll period" and a date anticipated for resuming work). The

General Contractor shall submit these forms to: The Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds, Department.

The City will take an active role in reviewing and monitoring these payrolls weekly. If the City suspects any violations, the City will report them to the Attorney General's Fair Labor and Practices Division. The Attorney General's Office, after conducting an investigation and a hearing can order the bidder to halt work, if it finds prevailing wage violations. Within fifteen days after completion of its portion of the work the bidder must submit a Statement of Compliance with the prevailing wage law. The City reserves the right to conduct hearings on bids that are significantly below the average bid price submitted on a project, to make findings of fact, and determinations. Weekly payrolls are public records and the bidder shall make them available upon request.

The Bidder is required to keep these records for a period of three years from the date of completion of this contract.

#### **Changes and Addenda**

If any changes are made to this IFB, an addendum will be issued. Addenda will be emailed to all bidders on record as having picked up the IFB. #### Modification or Withdrawal of Bids, Mistakes, and Minor Informalities

A bidder may correct, modify, or withdraw a bid by written notice received by the City of Somerville prior to the time and date set for the bid opening. Bid modifications must be submitted in a sealed envelope clearly labeled "Modification No.\_\_" to the address listed in part one of this section. Each modification must be numbered in sequence, and must reference the original IFB.

After the bid opening, a bidder may not change any provision of the bid in a manner prejudicial to the interests of the City or fair competition. Minor informalities will be waived or the bidder will be allowed to correct them. If a mistake and the intended bid are clearly evident on the face of the bid document, the mistake will be corrected to reflect the intended correct bid, and the bidder will be notified in writing; the bidder may not withdraw the bid. A bidder may withdraw a bid if a mistake is clearly evident on the face of the bid document, but the intended correct bid is not similarly evident.

#### **Right to Cancel/Reject Bids**

The City of Somerville may cancel this IFB, or reject in whole or in part any and all bids, if the City determines that cancellation or rejection serves the best interests of the City.

#### **Unbalanced Bids**

The City reserves the right to reject unbalanced, front loaded, and conditional bids.

#### **Bid Prices to Remain Firm**

All bid prices submitted in response to this IFB must remain firm for 60 days following the bid opening.

#### **Unforeseen Office Closure**

#### I. PROGRAM SCOPE

- 1. Preventative Maintenance (PM) services shall be provided by the Service Company on all equipment and associated devices related to the heating, ventilating, direct digital and control systems as outlined within this specification.
- 2. The Service Company shall furnish all personnel, parts, materials, test equipment, tools, and services in conformance with the terms and conditions as outlined below.
- 3. As part of this proposal, the Service Company shall submit for evaluation a comprehensive and detailed technical and business prospectus, descriptively outlining its ability to adequately and satisfactorily perform the services as requested in this specification.
- 4. It is the intention of this specification to establish and define those services that are to be performed and, in addition, to determine the capability and experience of the Service Company desiring to provide such services.
- 5. For required work outside the PM program, The Service Company shall provide written quotes to the City, which will use the hourly labor and supply rates that are included on the price form (Section VI). No work shall be performed without prior, written authorization by the City.

#### 6. SITE VISITS

A bidder may request a visit to the site of the equipment and proposed work prior to submitting their bid offering. The purpose of this visit is to acquaint the bidders with any and all conditions at the site and to identify, inspect and inventory the equipment. Bidders will contact Mr. Walter Whitney, Superintendent, Buildings & Grounds, DPW at 617-625-6600 ext. 5210 to schedule a facility survey. Bidders are not allowed to tour unescorted or at any time other than on the scheduled tours. The Service Company shall not be relieved from assuming all responsibility for properly estimating the difficulties and the cost of performing the services required with this specification, because of failure to investigate the conditions or become acquainted with all the information concerning the services to be performed. It is the intent of this specification to include all equipment as described in Sections IV, V, VI and VII, VIII & IX. No additional costs will be accepted to add additional equipment overlooked during the bid process. The only exception will be if the City of Somerville adds additional equipment to the facilities included in scopes after the bidders performed their equipment survey.

#### 7. EQUIPMENT

- a) Changes may be made to Equipment/Services/Buildings at the various buildings during the term of the contract. Additions and/or deletions of equipment and services will be completed via change order(s).
- b) Each bidder is required to provide mechanical service to the equipment listed in Exhibit 1 (equipment list to be used as reference only and may not be comprehensive). All building equipment will be included and a site visit is recommended.
- c) Each bidder is required to provide temperature and direct digital (as applicable) controls service to the equipment listed in **Exhibit 2** (equipment list to be used as reference only and may not be comprehensive). All building equipment will be included and a site visit is recommended. Software list to be used as reference only. All software will be included and a site visit is recommended.

#### 8. SOFTWARE UPDATEAND UPGRADES WILL BE REQUIRED UNDER THIS CONTRACT

- a) All miscellaneous building automation and control equipment will be included:
  - Power supplies, power filter modules

- Field control devices: temperature sensors, current sensors, duct sensors, transducers, power supplies, relays, all thermostats
- Damper motors & operators, automatic temperature control valves & operators
- b) The bidder must meet all requirements under the heading "Service Company Qualifications". Any bid which does not meet these requirements, is incomplete, conditional, obscure, or which contains additions not called for, or irregularities of any kind, may be cause for rejection of bid.
- c) All labor and material is to be part of this contract. Labor for all repairs and maintenance will be included. Maintenance type material is required and will consist of Filters grease, belts and such.
- d) It is not the intent to dictate the PM procedures to be performed on all equipment. Bidders will submit sample maintenance task sheets for evaluation by The City of Somerville department personnel.

#### II. SERVICE COMPANY QUALIFICATIONS

#### 1. EXPERIENCE

The Service Company shall demonstrate a minimum of (10) years' experience in the commercial, mechanical, temperature control and direct digital control business by attaching copies of state and local licenses and certificates.

#### 2. TECHNICIAN REQUIREMENTS

The Service Company shall employ a minimum of *three* (3) on-site, full time, competent servicemen who will have the technical background to maintain the mechanical, temperature control and direct digital systems. Specifically, at a minimum, these three on-site (3) servicemen will fall under the following technical roles:

- a) A minimum of two (2) Technicians / Trades Persons located in the City of Somerville during normal working hours (7am-4pm) Monday through Friday who have technical mastery and expertise for PM and repairs of the City's systems and who will be available during all normal working hours to work exclusively on the City's systems.
- b) A minimum of one (1) Control Technician located in the City of Somerville during normal working hours (7am-4pm) Monday through Friday. This Control Technician will be an expert in the direct digital control system that the City currently utilizes and will be available during all normal working hours to work exclusively on the City's systems. And will have the capacity to communicate electronic via email.
- c) The above-listed service persons shall be expert in the maintenance of all included mechanical systems and will be qualified to service the equipment type under contract as well as all associated pneumatic, electric, electronic and direct digital controls. Each of the above, on-site service persons working in City of Somerville's facilities shall have the requisite trade licenses issued by the State of Massachusetts to perform the services required to fulfill this contract. All bidders shall submit resumes for all proposed staff and must be able to confirm that the proposed staff can pass all appropriate background checks (e.g., CORI checks).
- d) Before award of this contract, the successful bidder will be required to detail and summarize the experience and qualifications of all proposed staff in maintaining covered equipment. Bidders shall present, in writing, a minimum of five (5) years' experience in servicing, calibrating and programming Honeywell Excel Plus DDC building automation equipment.
- e) All work on the Honeywell Excel 5000 DDC system must be done by persons in the direct employment of the bidder. No sub-contractors are permitted.
- f) Technicians who will be servicing the listed DDC equipment must be trained and qualified on Honeywell Excel 5000 building automation. This includes training and qualification in Honeywell CARE system programming.
- g) The service contractor shall have access to Honeywell Excel 5000 product and stock commonly used equipment. The service contractor shall demonstrate ability to obtain Honeywell Excel 5000 equipment and authorization to install same.

#### 3. REFERENCES

The Service Company shall submit a list of three (3) clients with similar full responsibility mechanical/direct digital service contracts in excess of \$1,000,000 who have been under contract with the bidder for a period of not less than five (5) years.

#### 4. SUBCONTRACTING

Services that are to be provided should be performed by qualified and trained service personnel that are directly employed by the Service Company. Under no condition shall any work specified herein be subcontracted without the owner's permission.

#### 5. ENGINEERING SUPPORT

The Service Company is required to maintain an engineering department staffed with (5) full time professionals (including 1 licensed mechanical engineer) in the fields of refrigeration, boilers, pneumatic, electric and electronic controls.

#### 6. PM SCHEDULING

- a) The Service Company shall schedule PM tasks by computer to assure a uniform and detailed method of scheduling work. Within one (1) month of contract award the contractor will submit their annual maintenance plan for systems through the City's facilities detailing all components to be maintained and the corresponding dates for service. In addition, the Service Company will provide the following:
  - A comprehensive asset/system inventory, which will include the year that system/component was installed, the model # and serial # and any known service records/history for that system/component;
  - ii. A comprehensive parts inventory, which will outline all of the spare parts that the Service Company determines will be necessary for the full length of the PM program (the Service Company will also provide information about whether these parts are actively maintained on hand and if not, the average lead time necessary for ordering them):
- b) Computerized service reports will be generated based on the annual maintenance plan and issued to the contractors service technicians on a monthly basis. A copy of each service report will be signed off on by the owners designated representative and sent to the Customer electronically.

- Copies of each final service report shall be issued to the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds and the Capitol Projects PM Manager.
- c) A reference list of five (5) customers with whom the bidder has for three (3) years had computerized PM covering total systems will be submitted as part of the contractors bid package. Contractor will also submit as part of the bid package a sample annual maintenance plan and computerized service reports that are currently being utilized at other contract locations.

#### 7. INVENTORY AND TEST EQUIPMENT

- a) The Service Company shall maintain in their local office an adequate inventory of replacement parts and components, and shall demonstrate they own the proper tools and test equipment to maintain all the systems under contract.
- b) In addition, the bidder shall maintain a central warehouse whose inventory includes replacement parts for system components under contract to ensure fast availability in emergency situations. This includes temperature sensors, electric and electronic, direct digital controls and pneumatic thermostats, dampers, valves, actuators, relays, supply, condenser and exhaust fan motors, etc.

#### 8. LICENSING

The Service Company (and all relevant staff) shall be fully licensed at the time of bid to do business at the job site, to provide complete service.

#### 9. OUALIFICATION COMPLIANCE

- a) The bidder shall indicate his complete and total compliance with the above Service Company Qualifications by a letter signed by a corporate officer of the firm, with complete listing of exception, if any.
- b) Successful bidder must show compliance by providing all information as outlined in Section II Service Company Qualifications.

#### III. GENERAL MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES

#### 1. MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES AND RECORDS

- a) All PM tasks shall be computer generated based on a program using each building's run time, manufacturer's maintenance recommendations and on no less than a ten (10) year data bank of maintenance experience and manufacturers' specifications to assure uniform, detailed, and all-inclusive method of defining PM tasks. Bidders will be required to show copies of said computer PM reports to demonstrate compliance to this requirement.
- b) The Service Company shall control scheduling the interval of PM and task functions to be performed by both calendar periods and operating hours (routine) as pertinent to each piece of equipment. A copy of the PM schedule and tasks shall be provided to both the Superintendent of Building and Grounds and the Capitol Project PM Manager.
- c) As work is scheduled, the Service Company shall issue, to the mechanic on the job, a computer-prepared service report detailing exactly what tasks to perform, skill levels required and special tools and instrumentation needed to maintain the systems at optimum comfort and efficiency levels.
- d) After each service call is completed, a service report shall be furnished to a designated representative of the client for signature as well as the Superintendent of Building and Grounds and the Capital Projects PM Manager for review
- e) After each service call report is signed off, details from the completed service report will be reentered in the data bank to assure closed-loop performance and continuous program updating. The client has ongoing access to this file within 48 hours.
- f) On a semi-annual basis, the Service Company shall advise and assist in the determination of improvements to the mechanical and control system that shall conserve energy and minimize utility expenditures.

g) By responding to this bid, the Service Company accepts all equipment as is, (in a maintainable condition). No additional charges or bills will be accepted to upgrade equipment to the Service Company's definition of maintainable. It is the Service Company's responsibility to assume all costs and risks associated with performing maintenance services at the facilities included in scope buildings.

#### 2. PM SERVICE CALLS

- a) Most scheduled PM service under this agreement will be performed during the clients normal working hours defined as 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.
- b) Client will provide reasonable means of access to all equipment covered by this agreement. The successful bidder will coordinate with the facility's designated representative to ensure that facility's activities are not interrupted during the performing of PM services.

#### 3. NON EMERGENCY REPAIR SERVICE

- a) For all repair work that is not covered under the PM program (per the excluded sections, below and throughout this specification), the Service Company shall provide written quotes to the City and will use the labor and materials prices included on the price form (Section VI). These quotes will be presented to the City, in writing, no more than three (3) business days after the initial finding.
- b) Once work is authorized by the City, work must be completed within thirty (30) days (unless the Service Company is able to provide justification for more time; i.e., special order of parts).
  - a. If either of the above response times are not met, the City intends to consider seeking all available remedies under the contract including liquidated damages.

#### 4. EMERGENCY SERVICE

- a) Every activity performed under this agreement is designed to minimize the incidence of emergency situations. However, backup emergency service will be provided 24 hours a day, seven (7) days a week (all holidays included) to minimize downtime and inconvenience. The Service Company shall provide emergency service on an as-needed basis.
- b) All labor, overtime, travel costs, parts, supplies, and any other expenses incurred on emergency calls that are determined to fall within the PM program shall be included in the fixed monthly fee of the PM program. The City will therefore not incur any additional cost for these services.
- c) Emergencies that are determined to fall outside of the PM program (per the excluded categories/services in each subsequent section) will not be included in the fixed fee of the PM program. For these non-PM repairs, the contractor will present the City with a written estimate before starting any work (per the hourly labor rates and supply rates included on the price form; Section VI). All non-PM work must be authorized by the City in writing before any work can begin.
- d) This emergency service shall be provided as often as needed, on a 24-hour basis, including weekends and holidays.
- e) The service company shall respond to all emergency calls with a qualified technician on site within two (2) hours. If the contractor cannot respond satisfactorily to the emergency, the City of Somerville may purchase the services of another vendor. The service contractor will then reimburse City of Somerville for the cost of services for that vendor.
- f) After hours answering service must be staffed by a person or persons under direct employment of the bidder.
- g) If any of the above response times are not met, the City intends to consider seeking all available remedies under the contract including liquidated damages.

#### 5. PARTS AND COMPONENT REPLACEMENT

- a. The Service Company will repair or replace worn parts or complete components with new parts or reconditioned components. It is understood that this undertaking by the contractor applies only to the systems and mechanical equipment covered in the PM program. The service company will provide a comprehensive list of parts and components covered under this contract to the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds and the Capital Projects PM Manager.
- b. For all repairs that are determined to fall outside of the PM program, the Service Company shall provide a written quote before beginning any work (using the labor and supplies rates included on the Price Form). The City of Somerville must authorize all non-PM work in writing before any work can begin.
- c. The Service Company shall not make replacements or repairs necessitated by reason of negligence or misuse of the equipment by anyone other than the Service Company. The contractor will identify any items that need to be repaired or replaced as a result of negligence or misuse and will report these to the City as soon as possible.
- d. The Service Company is responsible to repair or replace devices which have failed due to ordinary wear and tear and the environment in which the device functions, i.e., failure of controls due to high humidity condition.
- e. As noted above in Section II.B:

The Service Company shall employ a minimum of three (3) on-site, full time, competent servicemen who will have the technical background to maintain the mechanical, temperature control and direct digital systems. Specifically, at a minimum, these three (3) servicemen will fall under the following technical roles:

- i. A minimum of two (2) Technicians / Trades Persons located in the City of Somerville during normal working hours (7am-4pm) Monday through Friday who have technical mastery and expertise for PM and repairs of the City's systems and who will be available during all normal working hours to work exclusively on the City's systems.
- ii. A minimum of one (1) Control Technician located in the City of Somerville during normal working hours (7am-4pm) Monday through Friday. This Programmer Technician will be an expert in the direct digital control system that the City currently utilizes and will be available during all normal working hours to work exclusively on the City's systems.

#### 6. SERVICE AGREEMENT COVERAGE

- a. All travel and related expenses required to perform the inspection, calibration, and maintenance services described above shall be included in the fixed monthly fee of the PM program. All costs for labor, supplies and travel for repair work, emergency service, and any replacement supplies will be included in this fixed PM fee.
- b. If, during the course of routine maintenance, equipment repairs are identified and deemed necessary, the service contractor shall review them with the owner and discuss a course of action.
- c. The service contractor will not reload software, nor make repairs or replacements necessitated by reason of negligence or misuse of the Equipment by persons other than the service contractor's or its employees, or caused by lightning, electrical storm, or other violent weather or by any other cause beyond the service contractor's control. The contractor will provide such services at the owner's request and at an additional charge, in accordance with the rates included on the Price Form.
- d. The service contractor may install diagnostic devices and/or software at their own expense to enhance system operation and support. Upon termination of this Agreement, the service contractor may remove these devices and return the system to its original operation. If this

- option is exercised, the owner will provide connection to the switched telephone network for the diagnostic devices and/or software.
- e. The service contractor will review the Services delivered under this Agreement on an annual basis, unless otherwise noted.

#### IV. AIR FILTER MAINTENANCE

#### 1) EQUIPMENT INCLUDED AIR FILTRATION SYSTEM

Pre-filters, frame filters, pouch filters, fan coil filters, automatic roll-type filters and bag filters as applicable.

#### 2) SERVICES INCLUDED

- a) Filter frames, if applicable, shall be of the reusable type and shall be of a permanent rigid construction that shall permit the insertion of media pads, and may also allow the use of the optional pads with different efficiencies, if needed.
- b) Filter frames shall be sized to fill the entire cross section of the units to prevent blow-by and eliminate filter spacers in the system.
- c) Non frame type filters shall be high efficiency pleated filters, sized to fill the entire cross section of the units to prevent blow-by and eliminate filter spacers in the system.
- d) Unit ventilator filters shall be sized per manufacturers specifications and will be of the material type specified below:

Polyester
X Fiberglass
High efficiency pleated

- e) Frequency of changes will occur <u>4</u> times per year (*around* the following dates: April 1; July 1; October 1; January 1: final dates to be determined by the City).
- f) All filters are to be supplied by the Service Company.
- g) A list of Filters, their respective locations, and each corresponding piece of equipment shall be submitted to the Superintendent of Buildings & Grounds and the Capital Projects PM Manager.

#### V. ENVIRONMENTAL CONTROL SYSTEMS MAINTENANCE

#### 1. EQUIPMENT INCLUDES

All automatic temperature controls to include but not limited to: pneumatic air compressors, refrigerated air dryers, thermostats, sensors, controllers, pressure controls, relays, limits, automatic valves, automatic valve operators, damper motors, damper linkages, time clocks, contactors, direct digital controllers, building automation panels, building automation operator interface, capacity controls, safety controls and limits. Digital communicators and critical building monitoring points (sensors) are included in coverage.

#### 2. SERVICES INCLUDED

The general maintenance services listed below shall apply to the environmental systems and equipment as described above.

- a) Examine each piece of equipment and device to see that it is functioning properly and is in good operational condition.
- b) Clean all components of dust, old lubricants, etc. to allow the equipment to function as designed.
- c) Lubricate all equipment where needed to permit bearings, gears, linkages and all contact wearing points to operate freely and without undue wear.
- d) Adjust all linkages, motors, drives, etc. that have drifted from the correct design settings and positions.
- e) Calibrate all sensing, monitoring, output, safety, and read-out devices for proper ranges, settings, and optimum efficiencies 2 times per year.

- f) Check the sequence of operation for each control program in the building automation and direct digital control panels to ensure equipment is operating as originally designed. If changes to the original design programs have been made, the changes must be noted on the job drawings.
- g) Replace the device by the addition of replacement new parts, should the above maintenance not be adequate.
- h) Replace the device if needed, in view of its condition, age, and cost of previous and subsequent repair.
- i) Test and cycle all equipment as a system after it has been cleaned, lubricated, adjusted, and calibrated, to see that it is in good operational condition and is running at optimum efficiency.

#### 3. PARTS REPLACEMENT

- a) All parts, components, or devices for the environmental system as listed above that are worn or are not in proper operational condition, shall be repaired, and/or replaced with new parts, components, or devices.
- b) When equipment or parts are replaced in their entirety and a newer design of this device is available and is functionally equivalent and compatible, the device of the newer design shall be used as the replacement.
- c) All repair and replacement parts, components, and devices for the environmental systems and equipment as listed above shall be supplied by the Service Company and shall be included in the cost of the PM program.
- d) All miscellaneous parts and supplies necessary to maintain the environmental systems and equipment shall be supplied by the Service Company and shall be included in the cost of the service program.
- e) The service company will provide a comprehensive list of parts and components covered under this contract to the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds and the Capital Projects PM Manager.
- f) The Service Company shall not be made responsible for repairs or replacements necessitated by reason of negligence or misuse of the equipment by anyone other than the Service Company. Contractor is responsible to repair or replace devices, which have failed due to ordinary wear and tear and the environment in which the device functions.
- g) The Service Company shall be available, at no additional charge, for consultation regarding design changes and equipment selection, based on past experiences with similar systems.
- h) The Service Company shall provide and maintain a parts supply which shall be located at individual facility sites included in the scope of work. Critical, unique, or frequently used parts and supplies shall be stocked therein. This equipment shall remain the property of the Service Company until used and/or installed in the environmental systems.
- i) Service Company will be responsible for repairing or replacing any item or component that fails.

#### 4. EMERGENCY SERVICE

- a) To minimize downtime and inconvenience, emergency service will be provided on an as-needed basis, twenty four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week.
- b) The Service Company must respond to all emergency calls within two (2) hours, twenty four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week (all holidays included).
- c) All labor, overtime, travel costs, parts, supplies and any other expenses incurred and expended on such a call shall be provided by the Service Company and shall be included in the cost of the PM program (unless the necessary repairs are determined to fall outside of the PM program, in which case written quotes for such repairs shall be submitted to the City using the hourly/labor and supply rates listed on the Price Form, Section VI).
- d) If any of the above response times are not met, the City intends to consider seeking all available remedies under the contract including liquidated damages.

#### 5. EOUIPMENT NOT INCLUDED

- a) This service agreement does not include the repair or replacement of non-maintainable items such as pneumatic tubing, electrical wiring, and control cabinets.
- b) Manual control and isolation valves are not included in contract coverage.
- c) Variable Speed Drives

#### VI. MECHANICAL SYSTEM MAINTENANCE SERVICE

#### 1. EQUIPMENT INCLUDED

All heating and ventilating systems to include but not limited to: boilers, burners, gas fired domestic hot water heaters, circulating pumps, circulating pump motors, exhaust fan bearings and motors, cabinet heaters, fan coil units, air handling units and air conditioning equipment. The Service Company will provide (1) Month after contract is awarded a comprehensive list of mechanical systems and their locations to the Superintendent of Buildings & Grounds and the Capital Projects PM manager.

#### 2. SERVICES INCLUDED

The general services listed below shall apply to the systems and equipment described above.

- a) Examine each piece of equipment and device to see that it is functioning properly and is in good operational condition.
- b) Clean all components of dust, old lubricants, etc. to allow the equipment to function as designed.
- c) Paint all equipment as needed to prevent and protect against corrosion and deterioration.
- d) Lubricate all equipment where needed to permit bearings, gears, and all contact wearing points to operate freely and without undue wear.
- e) Adjust all linkages, motors, drives, etc. that have drifted from the initial design settings and positions.
- f) Calibrate all sensing, monitoring, output, safety, and read-out devices for proper ranges, settings, and optimum efficiencies.
- g) Repair the device by the addition of replacement parts, should the above maintenance not be adequate.
- h) Replace the device by the addition of replacement parts, should the above maintenance not be adequate.
- i) Test and cycle all equipment as a system after it has been cleaned, lubricated, adjusted and calibrated to assure that it operates to original design specifications.
- j) Cleaning of gas fired burners shall occur prior to October 1.
- k) This mechanical maintenance program includes all parts, labor and materials necessary to make the repairs or replace any defective component.
- 1) All condenser coils will be cleaned to ensure proper system operation. The Semi-annual maintenance plan will identify when each condenser coil will be cleaned.
- m) All exhaust systems will be thoroughly cleaned to include belt replacements (belt driven units) on a semi-annual basis.
- n) Boilers will be opened up and cleaned on an annual basis. An efficiency test will be performed on all boiler systems prior to October 1.
- o) All systems must be winterized by October 31st (i.e., applying anti-freeze to all A/C systems, etc.). *The City* will provide all necessary Glycol.

#### PARTS REPLACEMENT

- a) All parts, components, or devices for the mechanical systems as listed above that are worn or are not in proper operational condition shall be repaired, and/or replaced with new parts, components, or devices.
- b) When equipment or parts are replaced in their entirety and a newer design of this device is available and is functionally equivalent and compatible, the device of the newer design shall be used as the replacement.

- c) All repair and replacement parts, components, and devices for the mechanical systems and equipment as listed above shall be supplied by the Service Company and shall be included in the cost of the service program.
- d) All miscellaneous parts and supplies necessary to maintain the mechanical systems and equipment shall be supplied by the Service Company and shall be included in the cost of the service program (belts, valve packing's, lubricants, tools, paints, refrigerant, test instruments, meters, etc.).
- e) The service company will provide a comprehensive list of parts and components covered under this contract to the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds and the Capital Projects PM Manager.
- f) The Service Company shall not be made responsible for repairs or replacements necessitated by reason of negligence or misuse of the equipment by other than the Service Company. Contractor is responsible to repair or replace devices which have failed due to ordinary wear and tear and the environment in which the device functions.
- g) The Service Company shall provide and maintain a parts supply which shall be located at the individual facilities included in scope. Critical, unique, or frequently used parts and supplies shall be stocked therein. This equipment shall remain the property of the Service Company until used and/or installed in the environmental systems.
- h) The Service Company is responsible for scheduling the State Boiler Inspector to inspect all boilers annually and to be on site for such inspection.

#### 3. EMERGENCY SERVICE

- a) To minimize downtime and inconvenience, emergency service will be provided on an as-needed basis, twenty four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week.
- b) The Service Company must respond to all emergency calls within two (2) hours, twenty four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week (all holidays included).
- c) All labor, overtime, travel costs, parts, supplies and any other expenses incurred and expended on such a call shall be provided by the Service Company and shall be included in the cost of the service program (unless the necessary repairs are determined to fall outside of the PM program, in which case written quotes for such repairs shall be submitted to the City using the hourly labor and supply rates listed on the Price Form, Section VI).
- d) If any of the above response times are not met, the City intends to consider seeking all available remedies under the contract including liquidated damages.

#### 4. EQUIPMENT NOT INCLUDED

- a) Maintenance services, including repair labor and parts replacement, for portions of the systems and equipment that are not-maintainable or non-moving are not included as part of this specification.
- b) Excluded items shall be considered as: foundations, structural supports, domestic water lines, drains, plumbing, gas lines, refrigerant piping, boiler refractory, boiler shell and tubes, heat exchangers, insulation, air handling duct work, unit cabinets, electrical wiring, manual valves and Speed Drives.

#### VII. DIRECT DIGITAL CONTROL AND TRAINING

#### 1. HARDWARE SUPPORT

a) Service Company will perform scheduled maintenance services on the direct digital controls. Service Company will repair or replace serviceable components and parts found on the List of Maintained Equipment which have been found to be defective or have failed. Replaced components will be new or reconditioned components of compatible design as required to maintain the City of Somerville's system. At the Service Company's discretion, marginal components may also be repaired or replaced. These replacements will be based upon

- commercial availability of parts and/or components. All exchanged parts shall become the property of the Service Company responsible for the system.
- b) Inspection of Building Automation System: Inspection maintenance calls will be scheduled by a computer-scheduled service report detailing the tasks to perform, the skill levels required, and the special tools and instrumentation required to inspect the systems for optimum system performance, both from a hardware and software perspective.
- c) Typical activities include:
  - Checking software schedules against occupancy schedules.
  - Inspecting hardware, man-machine interface, and field panels, for proper operation.
  - Review false alarm activity.
  - Review trend logs.
  - Random sampling of temperature sensors to identify need to calibrate, and re-calibrate as required.

#### 2. SOFTWARE SUPPORT

- a) Service Company will maintain the present system within the functional and proprietary limitations of presently installed hardware and/or software. Third party applications and/or software including, but not limited to, operating system(s), web browsers, local area network (LAN) and computerized maintenance management systems and any labor, software and/or hardware required to maintain the present applications and/or implement functional enhancements, will be City of Somerville's sole responsibility.
- b) The Service Company will be responsible for costs associated with applicable proprietary system's software patches, revisions and/or bug fixes to the standard software in order to maintain present system operations.

#### 3. TRAINING

- a) Service Company will provide training for all City staff that work directly on the HVAC control systems and/or others that the City identifies over the course of the contract term. Service Company will provide unlimited phone- and internet-based training, in addition to on site and remote trainings (as needed).
- b) These trainings will span the various digital control systems that are in place in the City's HVAC system and will be current through the latest versions of software, etc.

#### 4. EMERGENCY SERVICE

- a) To minimize downtime and inconvenience, emergency service will be provided on an as-needed basis, twenty four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week.
- b) The Service Company must respond to all emergency calls within two (2) hours, twenty four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week (all holidays included).
- c) All labor, overtime, travel costs, parts, supplies and any other expenses incurred and expended on such a call shall be provided by the Service Company and shall be included in the cost of the PM program (unless the necessary repairs are determined to fall outside of the PM program, in which case written quotes for such repairs shall be submitted to the City using the hourly labor and supply rates listed on the Price Form, Section VI).
- d) If any of the above response times are not met, the City intends to consider seeking all available remedies under the contract including liquidated damages.

#### VIII. SYSTEM UPGRADE

This contract will require Software upgrades to include Honeywell, Intl. EBI software and Microsoft OS upgrades as required.

#### IX. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. CONTRACT PERFORMANCE GUARATNEE

- a) A bid bond equal to 5% of the bid amount must accompany each bid.
- b) A Performance Bond and a Payment Bond equal to 100% of the Contract Value will be supplied by the successful bidder for the three (3) year contract.
- c) No bidder may withdraw his bid for a period of thirty (30) days after the opening of bids.
- d) If the contractor neglects to complete any work properly, or if he should refuse to remedy any defects in his work due to inferior quality of workmanship or materials, or if he should in any manner fail to perform any provision of this contract, the City of Somerville (after five (5) days written notice to the contractor) may make good such deficiencies and deduct the cost thereof from the payment due or thereafter due to the contractor.

#### 2. INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

- a) Each bidder shall examine the building sites to familiarize himself with the conditions of the building and the equipment as it pertains to this maintenance contract.
- b) Each bidder shall examine all contract documents, noting particularly, all requirements which will affect his work in any way. Failure of a bidder to fully acquaint himself with the amount and nature of work required to complete this contract will not be considered subsequently as a basis for extra compensation.
- c) The wording of this proposal shall be retained throughout without change, alteration or addition. Should the bidder submit a proposal not in compliance with this specification, that proposal shall be considered void.

#### 3. CONTRACTORS RESPONSIBILITY

- a) The contractor shall use trained, personnel directly employed and supervised by him. These workmen must have appropriate licenses. A list of qualified workmen and their -credentials must be supplied with the original bid to the City of Somerville.
- b) The contractor shall have in his possession, the manufacturer's specified maintenance and repair procedures and complete parts list for all equipment to be maintained.
- c) The contractor, or his representative, shall report to the City of Somerville, or its' representative weekly. One (1) individual shall be responsible for reporting the number of men working on the job daily and for the completion and submission of weekly reports showing:
  - i. Dates
  - ii. Times of start and finish of each job.
  - iii. Brief description of work performed
  - iv. Name and number of parts replaced or repaired
  - v. Recommendations or comments pertaining to the operation of the mechanical system.
- d) The contractor shall not discriminate or permit discrimination against any person or group of persons on the grounds of race, creed or color, or national origin in any manner. Applicable sections of the State and Federal laws shall apply to all contracts entered into in connection with this work.
- e) If for some unknown or unforeseen reason or reasons, equipment must be shut down for an extended period, the City of Somerville shall be notified immediately of the problem, and of the measures being taken to restore the equipment to service as soon as possible.
- f) As work is scheduled, the contractor shall issue to the mechanic on the job the necessary and appropriate manufacturers recommended maintenance procedure and a listing of any special lubricants, tools, etc., that are required for proper maintenance of the apparatus concerned.
- g) All planned, PM service work under these specifications shall be performed during regular working hours of the regular working day.
- h) Emergency service, including overtime service shall be included under this contract. Service of this nature that may be required in order to keep the buildings systems in proper operating condition, shall be provided within two (2) hours from the time such call originates (including weekends and holidays). Emergency service shall be provided on a twenty-four (24) hour a day,

seven (7) day a week basis. After hour telephone calls for emergency service shall be answered directly by the contractor's personnel.

#### 4. PREVAILING WAGE LAW

Bidders will be required to comply with the Prevailing Wage laws, M.G.L. c.149. Every bidder will be required to submit a certified payroll to the City every week. The City will take an active role in reviewing and monitoring these payrolls weekly. If the City suspects any violations, the City will report them to the Attorney General's Fair Labor and Business Practices Division. The Attorney General's office, after conducting an investigation and a hearing can order the bidder to halt work, if it finds prevailing wage violations. Within fifteen days after completion of its portion of the work the bidder must submit a Statement of Compliance with the prevailing wage law. The City reserves the right to conduct hearings on bids that are significantly below the average bid price submitted on a project, to make findings of fact, and determinations. Weekly payrolls are public records and the bidder shall make them available upon request. The bidder is required to keep these records for a period of three years from the date of completion of this contract.

#### **Price Submission**

All prices must be listed as unit prices (per location), hourly rates for service must be listed as requested and cost of parts must be stated as requested on the price submission page.

#### **Estimated Quantities**

The City of Somerville cannot estimate the number of hours needed for repairs/service under this contract, since most of the work will be provided on an as needed basis. These estimates only and not guaranteed.

#### **Brand Name "Or Equal"**

Any references to any brand name or proprietary product in the specifications shall require the acceptance of an equal or better brand. Samples may be requested before a final decision is made. The City has the right to make the final determination as to whether an alternate brand is equal to the brand specified.

#### Warranty

The bidder warrants that (1) the Supplies sold are merchantable, (2) that they are fit for the purpose for which they are being purchased, (3) that they are absent any latent defects and (4) that they are in conformity with any sample which may have been presented to the City. The bidder guarantees that upon inspection, any defective or inferior Supplies shall be replaced without additional cost to the City. The Vendor will assume any additional cost accrued by the City due to the defective or inferior Supplies.

The bidder guarantees all Supplies for a period of one (1) year, or as otherwise specified herein.

#### **Invoicing**

The Vendor will mail an invoice to the ordering department after completion of the service and be authorized by a work order. All Invoice submissions must include a Vendor Work Order which was signed by the Department Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds, or his designee authorizing the work to be performed on a City Building/location. Any Invoices that are presented for payment, that do not have a signed work order backup, by a City designee, will not be paid by the City. All Invoices presented without a signed work order or accompanying weekly prevailing wage reports (if applicable) will not be paid.

#### Cancellation

The City reserves the right to cancel this contract at any time on any grounds, including the vendor's failure to comply with the specifications provided herein.

#### **Specifications**

#### General

The work to be performed under this contract consists of furnishing labor, materials, equipment and personnel for the HVAC Preventative Maintenance, Repairs and Controls for all Municipal Buildings & Schools.

#### **Examination of Property**

The contractor shall fully inform himself of the existing conditions where the work is to be done. The project contact is Mr. Walter W. Whitney, Superintendent, Buildings & Grounds, DPW, City of Somerville, at 617-625-6600, x 5210.

#### **Protection of Property**

The contractor shall take all precautions to protect the property of the City from injury and shall be held responsible for all employees or any person or persons, instrument or device directly or indirectly employed by him. Any corresponding damages shall be replaced, repaired and paid for by the contractor to the satisfaction of the City.

#### **Quality of Workmanship**

All work must be done in a thorough workmanlike manner by fully qualified personal. The contractor must be fully qualified to do all work described in these specifications. The City reserves the right to judge on the quality of workmanship of those bidding based either on work done for the City in the past or on work done for other companies and/or cities. Contractor must submit with his bid three (3) references showing similar work performed.

#### **Experience**

The contractor shall have been established in the specified field for at least 10 years.

#### **Response Time**

The contractor must respond within two (2) hours when issued notification by the City of Somerville.

#### **Laws and Regulations**

The Bidding procedures shall be in accordance with M.G.L. c. 149 as most recently amended and all other applicable laws. The contractor shall comply with all Federal, State and Local laws regulations and ordinances governing this type of work.

#### **Sales Tax Exemption**

Materials, equipment, and supplies for this project are exempt from sales tax in accordance with M.G.L. Chapter 64H, Section 6 (d). The City will furnish the successful bidder with its sales tax exemption number.

#### **Estimates and Surveys**

The contractor shall, as required, furnish estimates and survey proposed work at no cost to the City.

#### Insurance

The contractor must provide the following insurance certificates before the contract can be fully executed:

General Liability: \$1,000,000

Automobile: as required by General Law Workers' Compensation: as required by General Law

The Certificates of Insurance must show the <u>City of Somerville as the Certificate Holder and as Additional Insured.</u> Should any policies be cancelled before the expiration date, the issuing company must send written notice to the City 90 days prior to cancellation.

Information about Prevailing Wage Schedules for Awarding Authorities and Contractors

- This wage schedule applies only to the specific project referenced at the top of this page and uniquely identified by the "Wage Request Number" on all pages of this schedule.
- An Awarding Authority must request an updated wage schedule from the Department of Labor Standards ("DLS") if it has
  not opened bids or selected a contractor within 90 days of the date of issuance of the wage schedule. For CM AT RISK
  projects (bid pursuant to G.L. c.149A), the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the bid for the first
  construction scope of work must be within 90-days of the wage schedule issuance date.
- The wage schedule shall be incorporated in any advertisement or call for bids for the project as required by M.G.L. c. 149, § 27. The wage schedule shall be made a part of the contract awarded for the project. The wage schedule must be posted in a conspicuous place at the work site for the life of the project in accordance with M.G.L. c. 149 § 27. The wages listed on the wage schedule must be paid to employees performing construction work on the project whether they are employed by the prime contractor, a filed sub-bidder, or any sub-contractor.
- All apprentices working on the project are required to be registered with the Massachusetts Division of Apprentice Standards (DAS). Apprentice must keep his/her apprentice identification card on his/her person during all work hours on the project. An apprentice registered with DAS may be paid the lower apprentice wage rate at the applicable step as provided on the prevailing wage schedule. If an apprentice rate is not listed on the prevailing wage schedule for the trade in which an apprentice is registered with the DAS, the apprentice must be paid the journeyworker's rate for the trade.
- The wage rates will remain in effect for the duration of the project, except in the case of multi-year public construction projects. For construction projects lasting longer than one year, awarding authorities must request an updated wage schedule. Awarding authorities are required to request these updates no later than two weeks before the anniversary of the date the contract was executed by the awarding authority and the general contractor. For multi-year CM AT RISK projects, awarding authority must request an annual update no later than two weeks before the anniversary date, determined as the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the execution date of the first amendment to permit procurement of construction services. Contractors are required to obtain the wage schedules from awarding authorities, and to pay no less than these rates to covered workers. The annual update requirement is not applicable to 27F "rental of equipment" contracts.
- Every contractor or subcontractor which performs construction work on the project is required to submit weekly payroll
  reports and a Statement of Compliance directly to the awarding authority by mail or email and keep them on file for three years.
  Each weekly payroll report must contain: the employee's name, address, occupational classification, hours worked, and wages
  paid. Do not submit weekly payroll reports to DLS. A sample of a payroll reporting form may be obtained at
  http://www.mass.gov/dols/pw.
- Contractors with questions about the wage rates or classifications included on the wage schedule have an affirmative obligation to inquire with DLS at (617) 626-6953.
- Employees not receiving the prevailing wage rate set forth on the wage schedule may report the violation to the Fair Labor Division of the office of the Attorney General at (617) 727-3465.
- Failure of a contractor or subcontractor to pay the prevailing wage rates listed on the wage schedule to all employees who
  perform construction work on the project is a violation of the law and subjects the contractor or subcontractor to civil and
  criminal penalties.

### Section 2: THE WORK.

The Contractor shall execute all work described in the Contract Documents, except to the extent that such work is specifically indicated in the Contract Documents to be the responsibility of others. In accordance with Chapter 30, section 39I of the General Laws, the contractor shall perform all of work in conformity with the plans and specifications included herein as Appendix A. No willful or substantial deviation from such plans and specifications shall be made unless authorized in writing by the Commissioner of Public Works, which authorization shall be confirmed by written change order within thirty days.

### Section 3: PROJECT DATES

- (a) <u>Commencement:</u> The Date of Commencement shall be stipulated by a written Notice to Proceed given by the City to the Contractor.
- (b) <u>Substantial Completion</u>: The Contractor shall achieve substantial completion of the work no later than <u>scheduled</u> in the bid <u>documents</u> or <u>date</u> after the Date of Commencement, time being of the essence. For good cause shown, the Commissioner of Public Works may, in his sole discretion, extend the date of substantial completion by written change order.
- (c) <u>Damages for Delay</u>. The Contractor and the Contractor's surety shall be liable for and shall pay the City the sum of \$100.00 per calendar day, as liquidated damages, for each calendar day of delay until the work is substantially completed or, in the case of the portion of the work, for each calendar day of delay until the portion of the work is substantially completed. Substantial Completion shall mean either a) that the work, or portion of the work, has been completed, except for work having a contract price of less than one percent (1%) of the then adjusted total contract price; or b) that substantially all of the work has been completed and opened to public use, except for minor incomplete or unsatisfactory work items that do not materially impair the usefulness of the work.
- (d) <u>Suspension of the Work/Excusable Delays</u>. If the City is required to suspend the work as a result of a request from the Office of the Attorney General in connection with a bid protest or an injunction, the Contractor shall not have a claim for damages, but the City shall extend the date of substantial completion for a period of time commensurate with the period of the suspension, and the liquidated damages clause shall not take effect until the extended date of substantial completion. If any of the following occurrences causes a delay in the work, the Contractor shall immediately notify DPW in writing. If, upon investigation, the City finds that the delay is excusable, the City shall extend the date of substantial completion for a period of time commensurate with the period of the excusable delay, and the liquidated damages clause shall not take effect until the extended date of substantial completion:
- any acts of the Government, including controls or restrictions upon or requisitioning of materials, equipment, tools, or labor by reason of war, National Defense, or any other national emergency;
- (2) delays which are caused by the City and which are not occasioned by the Contractor's failure to supply DPW or its design professional with progress schedules, documents, samples, and the like, in a timely manner;
- (3) causes not reasonably foreseeable by the parties to this Contract, which are beyond the reasonable control of the Contractor, such as blizzards, floods, hurricanes, tornadoes, and strikes;
  - (4) any delay of any subcontractor resulting from paragraphs (1), (2), or (3);

### Section 4. CONTRACT SUM

The contract sum shall be \$contract amount. The contract sum may be increased or decreased by change order, as quantities which have been estimated in the bid documents become known, or as other additions or deletions to the work are made, or if the work is interrupted or suspended by the City, all as set forth herein.

### Section 5. CHANGES IN THE CONTRACT

- (2) Suspension, Delay, or Interruption due to order of Awarding Authority.
- (1) The Awarding Authority may order the General Contractor in writing to suspend, delay, or interrupt all or any part of the work for such period of time as it may determine to be appropriate for the convenience of the Awarding Authority; provided, however, that if there is a suspension, delay, or interruption for fifteen days or more or due to a failure of the Awarding Authority to act within the time specified in this contract, the Awarding Authority shall make an adjustment in the contract price for any increase in the cost of performance of this contract but shall not include any profit to the General Contractor on such increase; and provided further, that the Awarding Authority shall not make any adjustment in the contract price under this provision for any suspension, delay, interruption, or failure to act to the extent that such is due to any cause for which this contract provides for an equitable adjustment of the contract price under any other contract provisions.
- (2) The General Contractor must submit the amount of a claim under provision (1) to the Awarding Authority in writing as soon as practicable after the end of the suspension, delay, interruption or failure to act and, in any event, not later than the date of final payment under this contract and, except for costs due to a suspension order, the Awarding Authority shall not approve any costs in the claim incurred more than twenty days before the General Contractor notified the Awarding Authority in writing of the act or failure to act involved in the claim.
- (3) A subcontractor shall have the same rights against the General Contractor for payment for an increase in the cost of its performance as provisions (1) and (2) give the General Contractor against the Awarding Authority, but nothing in provisions (1) and (2) shall in any way change, modify or alter any other rights which the General Contractor or the subcontractor may have against each other.
- (b) Change Orders. No willful and substantial deviation from the plans and specifications shall be made unless authorized in writing by the Awarding Authority or by the Design Professional in charge of the work who is duly authorized by the Awarding Authority to approve such deviations. In order to avoid delays in the prosecution of the work required by the contract, such deviation from the plans and specifications may be authorized by a written order of the Awarding Authority or Design Professional so authorized, to be confirmed at a later time by a written Change Order, signed under penalties of periury. using AIA Document G701 (or its equivalent). The Change Order shall include the following: (1) if such deviation involves any substitution or elimination of materials, fixtures or equipment, the reasons why such materials, fixtures or equipment were included in the first instance and the reasons for substitution or elimination, and, if the deviation is of any other nature, the reasons for such deviation, giving justification therefor; (2) that the specified deviation does not materially injure the project as a whole; (3) that either the work substituted for the work specified is of the same cost and quality, or that an equitable adjustment [increase or decrease as the case may be] has been agreed upon between the Contracting Agency and the General Contractor and the amount in dollars of such adjustment; and (4) that the deviation is in the best interest of the Contracting Authority. The Change Order shall also indicate whether or not the date of substantial completion has been extended. The equitable adjustment in price shall be determined by the

unit prices, if any, in the General Contractor's bid; otherwise, it shall be a number which is agreed to by both parties as a fair adjustment and which can be itemized and substantiated to the reasonable satisfaction of the Contracting Authority. Where increases and decreases to the Contract Sum are included in one Change Order, the negotiated allowance for overhead and profit shall be calculated on the basis of the net increase, if any.

(c) Differing Subsurface or Latent Physical Conditions. In accordance with Chapter 30, section 39N of the General Laws, if, during the progress of the work, the Contractor or the Awarding Authority discovers that the actual physical subsurface or latent physical conditions encountered at the site differ substantially or materially from those shown on the plans or indicated in the contract documents, either the Contractor or the Contracting [Awarding] Authority may request an equitable adjustment in the contract price of the contract applying to work affected by the differing site conditions. A request for such an adjustment shall be in writing and shall be delivered by the party making such claim to the other party as soon as possible after such conditions are discovered. Upon receipt of such a claim from a Contractor, or upon its own initiative, the Contracting Authority shall make an investigation of such physical conditions, and, if they differ substantially or materially from those shown on the plans or indicated in the contract documents or from those ordinarily encountered and generally recognized as inherent in work of the character provided for in the plans and contract documents and are of such a nature as to cause an increase or decrease in the cost of performance of the work or a change in the construction methods required for the performance of the work which results in an increase or decrease in the cost of the work. the Contracting Authority shall make an equitable adjustment in the contract price and the contract shall be modified in writing accordingly.

### Section 6. PAYMENTS TO THE CONTRACTOR

- (a) Progress Payments. The Contractor may submit requests for progress payments (hereafter, "Periodic Estimates") for work completed during the preceding month and for materials not incorporated in the work, but delivered and suitably stored at the site (or some other location agreed upon in writing). The Contractor's progress schedule and schedule of values, as modified by agreement of the parties, may be used by the City as a basis for reviewing the Contractor's Periodic Estimates. In the case of contracts for construction, reconstruction, alteration, remodeling, repair, or demolition of a public building, where the amount is more than two thousand dollars, the Contractor's Periodic Estimate shall contain a separate item for each filed subtrade and sub-subtrade, and a column listing the amount paid to each subcontractor and sub-subcontractor as of the date the periodic estimate is filed, as required by Chapter 30, Section 39K, of the General Laws.
- (1) <u>Time for Payment</u>. In the case of contracts for construction, reconstruction, alteration, remodeling, repair or demolition of a public building, where the amount is more than two thousand dollars, the City shall, in accordance with Chapter 30, Section 39K, of the General Laws, make payment within fifteen days of receipt of the Contractor's Periodic Estimate; provided however, that the City may, within seven days of receipt of an estimate which is not in the required form or which is arithmetically incorrect, return the incorrect estimate to the Contractor for correction, whereupon the date of receipt shall be the date of receipt of the corrected Periodic Estimate. For all other construction contracts, progress payments are governed by Chapter 30, Section 39G of the General Laws, and the City is required to make payment within thirty-five days of receipt of a Periodic Estimate.
- (2) <u>Retainage prior to Substantial Completion</u>. In all construction contracts, the City may hold back a retainage of up to five percent of each progress payment to ensure satisfactory completion of the work. In addition, the City may withhold any amounts in dispute, including disputed change orders and direct payments owed to subcontractors pursuant to Chapter 30. Section 39F of the General Laws.

- (b) <u>Payment upon Substantial Completion.</u> In the case of contracts for construction, reconstruction, alteration, repair, remodeling, or demolition of a public building, where the amount is more than \$2,000, Chapter 30, Section 39K, of the General Laws governs payment upon substantial completion. For all other contracts, Chapter 30, Section 39F of the General Laws governs payment upon substantial completion.
- (1) <u>Definition of Substantial Completion.</u> Substantial Completion shall mean either a) that the work, or portion of the work, has been completed, except for work having a contract price of less than one percent (1%) of the then adjusted total contract price; or b) that substantially all of the work has been completed and opened to public use, except for minor incomplete or unsatisfactory work items that do not materially impair the usefulness of the work.
- (2) Certificate of Substantial Completion. The Contractor shall give written notice to the City when the Contractor is of the opinion that the work has been substantially completed. Within twenty-one days of receipt of such notice, provided there is no dispute as to whether the work has been substantially completed, a Certificate of Substantial Completion signed by the City's Design Professional, or a written Declaration of Substantial Completion signed by the Executive Director of Mayor's Office of Strategic Planning and Community Development (on AIA form # G701 or its equivalent) shall be given to the Contractor. The date of such Certificate or Declaration shall be the Effective Date of Substantial Completion, subject to the provisions of Chapter 30, Section 39J, of the General Laws. If the City does not agree that the work has been substantially completed, the City or the City's Design Professional shall. within the twenty-one day period, present the Contractor with a written, itemized list of incomplete or unsatisfactory work items sufficient to demonstrate that the work has not been substantially completed. If the City fails to respond within the twenty-one day period, the date of the Contractor's notification of substantial completion shall become the "Effective Date of Substantial Completion". Within fifteen days after the effective date of the City's declaration of substantial completion, the City shall send to the Contractor by certified mail, return receipt requested, a complete list of all incomplete or unsatisfactory work items and, unless delayed by causes beyond his control, the Contractor shall complete all such work items within forty-five days after receipt of said list or before the date of substantial completion in the contract, whichever is later. If the Contractor fails to complete such work within such time, the City may send the Contractor a notice in writing by certified mail, return receipt requested, instructing the Contractor that if the work is not completed with seven days after receipt of the notice, the contract will be terminated and the City will complete the incomplete or unsatisfactory work items and charge the cost of the same to the Contractor and the Contractor's sureties.
- (3) Retainage after Substantial Completion. Within sixty-five days after the Effective Date of Substantial Completion, the City shall pay the Contractor all but one percent retainage, minus: a) the amount of any disputed work item; and b) five (5) percent of the value of plant materials in the ground; and c) the City's estimated cost of completing all incomplete and unsatisfactory work items. The City shall also deduct an amount equal to the sum of all demands for direct payment filed by subcontractors and not yet paid to subcontractors or deposited in joint accounts pursuant to Chapter 30, Section 39F of the General Laws. The five (5) percent retainage of the value of all plant materials in the ground shall be withheld by the City until final acceptance of such plant materials at the end of the guarantee period.
- (c) <u>Final Payment</u>. The City shall make final payment to the Contractor within thirty days of completion of the work and submission of all documentation required.

IF FORMS FOR WAGE CERTIFICATIONS AND OTHER DOCUMENTATION ARE SUPPLIED BY THE CITY TO THE CONTRACTOR, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL SUBMIT DOCUMENTATION ON SUCH FORMS.

(d) <u>Interest.</u> If the City fails to pay the Contractor within the time periods mandated by statute, the City shall pay interest to the Contractor in accordance with Chapter 30, Sections 39G and 39K, whichever is applicable.

### Section 7. PAYMENT OF SUBCONTRACTORS.

In accordance with Chapter 30, Section 39F of the General Laws, the subparagraphs a) through h) of this section shall be binding on contracts awarded pursuant to Chapter 30, Section 39M of the General Laws, and paragraphs a) through i) shall be binding on contracts awarded pursuant to Chapter 149, Section 44A of the General Laws:

- (a) Immediately after the Contractor receives payment on account of a periodic estimate, the Contractor shall pay each subcontractor the amount paid for labor performed and materials furnished by that subcontractor, less any amount specified in any court proceedings barring such payment and also less any amount claimed due from the subcontractor to the Contractor.
- (b) Not later than the sixty-fifth day after each subcontractor substantially completes his work in accordance with the plans and specifications, the entire balance due under the subcontract less amounts retained by the City as the estimated cost of completing the incomplete and unsatisfactory items of work, shall be due the subcontractor; and the City shall pay that amount to the Contractor. The Contractor shall immediately pay to the subcontractor the full amount received from the City less any amount specified in any court proceeding barring such payment and also less any amount claimed due from the subcontractor by the Contractor.
- (c) Each payment made by the City to the Contractor pursuant to subparagraphs a) and b) of this section for the labor performed and materials furnished by a subcontractor shall be made to the Contractor for the account of that subcontractor; and the City shall take reasonable steps to compel the Contractor to make each such payment to each such subcontractor. If the City has received a demand for direct payment from a subcontractor for any amount which has been included in a payment to the Contractor or which is to be included in a payment to the Contractor for payment to the subcontractor as provided in subparagraphs a) and b), the City shall act upon the demand as provided in this section.
- If, within seventy days after the subcontractor has substantially completed the subcontract work, the subcontractor has not received from the Contractor the balance due under the subcontract, including any amount due for extra labor and materials furnished to the Contractor, less any amount retained by the City as the estimated cost of completing the incomplete and unsatisfactory items of work, the subcontractor may demand direct payment of that balance from the City. The demand shall be by a sworn statement delivered to or sent by certified mail to the City, and a copy shall be delivered to or sent by certified mail to the Contractor at the same time. The demand shall contain a detailed breakdown of the balance due under the subcontract and also a statement of the status of completion of the subcontract work. Any demand made after substantial completion of the subcontract work shall be valid even if delivered or mailed prior to the seventieth day after the subcontractor has substantially completed the subcontract work. Within ten days after the subcontractor has delivered to or so mailed the demand to the City and delivered or so mailed a copy to the Contractor, the Contractor may reply to the demand. The reply shall be by sworn statement delivered to or sent by certified mail to the City and a copy shall be delivered to or sent by certified mail to the subcontractor at the same time. The reply shall contain a detailed breakdown of the balance due under the subcontract including any amount due for extra labor and materials furnished to the Contractor and of the amount due for each claim made by the Contractor against the subcontractor.

- (e) Within fifteen days after receipt of the demand by the City, but in no event prior to the seventieth day after substantial completion of the subcontract work, the City shall make direct payment to the subcontractor of the balance due under the subcontract including any amount due for extra labor and materials furnished to the Contractor, less any amount (1) retained by the City as the estimated cost of completing incomplete or unsatisfactory items of work, (2) specified in any court proceedings barring such payment, or (3) disputed by the Contractor in the sworn reply; provided, that the City shall not deduct from a direct payment any amount as provided in part (3) if the reply is not sworn to, or for which the sworn reply does not contain the detailed breakdown required by subparagraph (d). The City shall make further direct payment to the subcontractor immediately after the removal of any basis for deductions set forth in (1) or (2) above.
- (f) The City shall promptly deposit disputed amounts in an interest-bearing, joint account in the names of the Contractor and the subcontractor, in a bank in Massachusetts selected by the City or agreed upon by the Contractor and the subcontractor, and shall notify the Contractor and the subcontractor of the date of the deposit and the bank receiving the deposit. The bank shall pay the amount in the account, including accrued interest, as provided in an agreement between the Contractor and the subcontractor or as determined by decree of a court of competent jurisdiction.
- (g) All direct payments and all deductions from demands for direct payments deposited in an interest-bearing account or accounts in a bank pursuant to subparagraph (f) shall be made out of amounts payable to the Contractor at the time of receipt of a demand for direct payment from a subcontractor and out of amounts which later become payable to the Contractor and in the order of receipt of such demands from the subcontractors. All direct payments shall discharge the obligation of the City to the Contractor to the extent of such payment.
- (h) The City shall deduct from payments to the Contractor amounts which, together with the above-mentioned bank deposits, are sufficient to satisfy all unpaid demands for direct payment received from subcontractors. All such amounts shall be earmarked for direct payments to such subcontractors, whose claims shall have priority over all other creditors of the Contractor.
- (i) If the subcontractor does not receive payment as provided in subparagraph (a), or if the Contractor does not submit a Periodic Estimate for the value of the labor or materials performed or furnished by the subcontractor, and the subcontractor does not receive payment for the same when due less the deductions provided for in subparagraph (a), the subcontractor may demand direct payment by following the procedure in subparagraph (d) and the Contractor may file a sworn reply as provided in that same subparagraph. A demand made after the first day of the month following that for which the subcontractor performed or furnished the labor and materials for which the subcontractor seeks payment shall be valid even if delivered or mailed prior to the time payment was due on a Periodic Estimate from the Contractor. Thereafter, the City shall proceed as provided in subparagraph (e), (f) (g) and (h).

### Section 8. PREVAILING WAGE REQUIREMENTS.

(2) The Contractor shall pay wages at no less than the wage rates set forth in Appendix G, incorporated as part of this Agreement: namely, State Prevailing Wage Rates; provided, however, that if any department of the City should make use of this Contract for a project which is federally funded, then the Contractor shall pay wages at the higher of the two rates. If a labor classification is not listed the Contractor shall notify DPW and request instructions. In addition, the Contractor shall:

- pay wages at least once a week;
- (2) submit payroll information on a weekly basis in a format approved by DPW, numbered in numerical sequence and signed by the Contractor (including forms for weeks when the Contractor is not on the site, in which case there shall be a notation to the effect "no work this payroll period" and a date anticipated for resuming work);
- (b) The Contractor shall submit to DPW within the first week of construction:
  - (1) a list of apprenticeship programs with which the Contractor is affiliated;
  - (2) the number of apprentices on the Project employed by the Contractor.
  - a list of the Contractor's employee fringe benefits;
  - a copy of each project schedule, including the anticipated commencement date for each Subcontractor; and
  - (5) a list of each Subcontractor's suppliers and material men.
- (c) The contractor shall include language similar to the above in all subcontracts.

### Section 9. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY/NONDISCRIMINATION

- a) the Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, marital status, sexual orientation, national origin, age, disability, Vietnam Era veteran status or because an employee or applicant is a recipient of federal, state, or local public assistance or housing subsidies: and
- b) the Contractor shall not discriminate, in any stage of the contract from award to completion, in the selection or retention of subcontractors, suppliers, and materialmen, or in the procurement of materials or supplies, or the rental of equipment, on the basis of race, religion, sex, marital status, sexual orientation, national origin, age, disability, Vietnam Era veteran status, or because an individual is a recipient of federal, state, or local public assistance or housing subsidies; and
- c) the Contractor shall post an equal employment opportunity notice in conspicuous places at the worksite, shall make copies of such notice available to employees and job applicants, and shall send such notice to each labor union or representative of workers with which the Contractor has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding; and
- d) the Contractor shall, to the greatest extent feasible, give employment and on-site training opportunities, to lower-income, minority, women, and disabled members of the local community and shall award subcontracts, when possible, to Minority Business Enterprises (MBE) and Women Business Enterprises (WBE).
  - e) the contractor shall include language similar to the above in all subcontracts.

### Section 10. COPELAND ANTI-KICKBACK ACT.

If this contract is in excess of \$2,000 and is federally funded, the Contractor shall comply with the Copeland "Anti-Kickback Act" (18 U.S.C. 874 and 29 CFR Part 3) more

fully set forth in Appendix G attached hereto, and shall not induce any person employed in the construction, completion, or repair of a public building or public work, to give up any part of the compensation to which he would otherwise be entitled.

### Section 11. WORK HOURS AND SAFETY STANDARDS.

If this contract is in excess of \$2,000 and is federally funded, the Contractor shall comply with Sections 103 and 107 of the Contract Work Hours Safety Standards Acts (40 U.S.C. 327-333), as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations at 29 CFR part 5. To that end, the Contractor shall compute the wages of every mechanic and laborer on the basis of a standard workweek of 40 hours. Work in excess of the standard workweek is permissible, provided that the worker is compensated at a rate of not less than 1-1/2 times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of 40 hours in the workweek. The Contractor shall ensure that no laborer or mechanic is required to work in surroundings or under working conditions which are unsanitary, hazardous, or dangerous.

### Section 12. CLEAN AIR ACT AND FEDERAL WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT.

If this contract is in excess of \$100,000 and is federally funded, the Contractor shall comply with all applicable standards, orders, or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7401 et seq.) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act as amended (33 U.S.C. 1251 et seq.)

### Section 13. CONTRACTOR'S CERTIFICATIONS.

The Contractor hereby certifies under oath:

- (a) That if this Contract is in excess of \$100,000 and is federally funded, the Contractor will abide by the Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment (31 U.S.C.1352), and more specifically:
  - (1) That no federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress, in connection with the awarding of this Federal contract and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of this Federal contract; and
  - (2) That if any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal contract, the Contractor will complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying", in accordance with its instructions; and
- (3) That the Contractor will include the language of this certification in all subcontracts, and that all subcontractors shall certify and disclose accordingly.

THIS CERTIFICATION IS A MATERIAL REPRESENTATION OF FACT UPON WHICH RELIANCE WAS PLACED WHEN THIS THE AWARD OF THIS CONTRACT WAS MADE. ANY PERSON WHO FAILS TO FILE THE REQUIRED CERTIFICATION SHALL BE SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY OF NOT LESS THAN \$10,000 AND NOT MORE THAN \$100,000 FOR EACH FAILURE.

- (b) <u>Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988 (42 U.S.C. 701):</u>
  That, if this Contract is federally funded, the Contractor will provide a drug-free workplace and comply with the HUD rules contained in 24 CFR part 24M, including notification to employees that the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession or use of a controlled substance is prohibited; that action will be taken against employees violating the prohibition; and that an employee who is convicted of manufacturing, distributing, dispensing, possession, or use of a controlled substance may be terminated or required to participate in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purpose by a Federal, State, or local health, law enforcement, or other appropriate agency.
  - (c) <u>Debarment and Suspension:</u> That the Contractor is a duly licensed general contractor, and
  - (1) That neither the Contractor nor any of its principal employees are on the General Services Administration's List of Parties Excluded from Federal Procurement or Nonprocurement Programs [E.O. 12549 and E.O. 12689 at 24 CFR part 24, applicable to contracts exceeding the small purchase threshold of fixed by 41 U.S.C. 403 (11); and
  - (2) That the Contractor has not been debarred or suspended by any state agency or city or town in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.
- (e) <u>Noncollusion</u>: That the bid upon which this Contract was based was made without collusion or fraud with any other person and was in all respects bona fide and fair. As used in this paragraph, the word "person" shall mean any natural person, joint venture, partnership, corporation, or other business or legal entity.
- (f) <u>Tax Compliance:</u> That the Contractor is in full compliance with all federal and state laws relating to income taxes, and has paid all real estate and personal property/excise taxes, water charges, fines and other municipal lien charges due to the City of Somerville, and the Contractor's Federal Tax Identification Number is #

### Section 14. CONTRACTOR'S RECORDS.

- (a) Federal Requirements: The Contractor shall permit the City, HUD and/or any other administering agency named herein, the Comptroller General of the United States, or any of their duly authorized representatives, to have access to any books, documents, papers, and records of the Contractor which are directly pertinent to a specific HUD program for the purpose of making audits, examinations, excerpts, and transcriptions.
- (2) <u>State Requirements:</u> In accordance with G.L. Chapter 30, §39R, for contracts in an amount or estimated amount greater than \$100,000: (i) the General Contractor shall make and keep for at least six years after final payment, books, records, and accounts which in reasonable detail accurately and fairly reflect the transactions and dispositions of the Contractor; and (ii) until the

expiration of six years after final payment, the office of the Inspector General and the Commissioner of Capital Asset Management and Maintenance shall have the right to examine any books, documents, papers or records of the Contractor or of his subcontractors that directly pertain to and involve transactions relating to the Contractor or his subcontractors; and (iii) the Contractor shall describe any change in the method of maintaining records or recording transactions which materially affect any statements filed with the Awarding Authority, including in his description the date of the change and reasons therefor and shall accompany said description with a letter from the Contractor's independent certified public accountant approving or otherwise commenting on the changes; and (iv) the Contractor shall have filed a Statement of Management on Internal Accounting Controls, as described in paragraph "(1)" below prior to the execution of the Contract; and (v) the Contractor has filed prior to execution of the Contract and will continue to file annually, an Audited Financial Statement for the most recent completed fiscal year as set forth in paragraph "(2)" below.

- (1) The Statement of Management on Internal Accounting Controls is a written statement certifying that the system of internal accounting controls of the Contractor and its subsidiaries reasonably assures that transactions are executed in accordance with management's general and specific authorization; that transactions are recorded as necessary to permit preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles and to maintain accountability for assets; that access to assets is permitted only in accordance with management's general or specific authorization; and that recorded accountability for assets is compared with the existing assets at reasonable intervals and appropriate action was taken with respect to any difference.
- (2) The Audited Financial Statement is a statement prepared and signed by an independent certified public accountant, stating that he has examined the Statement of Management on internal accounting controls, and expressing an opinion as to (i) whether such representations of management are, in addition, reasonable with respect to transactions and assets in amount which would be material when measured in relation to the applicant's financial statements

The Contractor shall annually file with the Commissioner of Capital Asset Management and Maintenance during the term of the contract a financial statement prepared by an independent certified public accountant on the basis of an audit by such accountant. The final statement filed shall include the date of final payment. All statements shall be accompanied by an accountants report. Such statements shall be made available to the Awarding Authority upon request.

(c) Records and statements required to be made, kept or filed under the provisions of this section shall not be public records as defined in G.L. 4, §7 or equivalent federal legislation. They shall not be made available to the public, but shall be available only to the governmental authorities named herein

### Section 15. CONFLICT OF INTEREST LAWS.

The City and the Contractor shall comply with all federal and state conflict of interest statutes and regulations.

### Section 16. EVENTS OF DEFAULT.

The following shall be considered Events of Default:

- a. The Contractor makes a written admission of the Contractor's inability to pay debts; or the Contractor becomes the debtor or defendant in (i) a voluntary or involuntary petition in bankruptcy, (ii) a petition for appointment of a receiver, (iii) a levy of an attachment or execution, (iv) an assignment for the benefit of creditors, (v) a winding up or dissolution of a partnership or corporation; or (vi) any other proceeding under which a court of competent jurisdiction assumes custody or control over the Contractor.
- b. The Contractor fails to prosecute the work with such diligence as will, in the reasonable estimation of the City, ensure substantial completion within the time specified in the Contract Documents; and/or
- c. The Contractor is in breach of the Contract Documents and has failed to cure such breach after written notice from the City specifying 1) the breach, 2) what must be done to cure the breach; and 3) the time within which the breach must be cured.

### Section 17. REMEDIES UPON DEFAULT.

a. <u>HUD Action.</u> If the Contractor is in default, HUD and/or any other administering agency named herein may, with or without the consent of the City, cancel.

suspend, or terminate this Contract in whole or in part; require the withholding or disallowance all or part of the funding for the project; declare the contractor ineligible for further Government contracts or avail itself of any other remedies available under the law.

- b. <u>City Action</u>. If the Contractor is in default, the City may elect to do any or all of the following: 1) temporarily withhold cash payments pending correction of the deficiency; and/or 2) terminate this Contract, and
  - (a) hold the Contractor and its sureties liable in damages;
  - (b) require the Contractor's sureties to complete the Contract;
- (c) take possession and use any materials, machinery, implements, and tools on the site, without liability for loss or damage, following which use, the Contractor shall be liable for their removal from the site;
- (d) complete the work using the services of another contractor (in which case the City shall have no obligation to use a competitive process to obtain the lowest contract prices) and look to the Contractor and the Contractor's sureties for the difference between the cost to complete the work and the contract sum hereunder.

### Section 18. TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE.

(a) The City may terminate this Contract without cause, at any time, effective upon the date of termination specified by written notice to the Contractor, in which case, the Contractor shall be compensated for: (1) sums due under this Contract incurred up to the date of termination for all Work performed and accepted by the City up to the termination date, calculated on a percentage completion basis covering the period of time between the last approved application for payment and the date of termination using the progress schedule and schedule of values. The Contractor shall use its best efforts to mitigate any expenses and shall in no event incur any new obligations after the date of termination.

- (1) Payment by the City as provided in this section shall be deemed to fully compensate the Contractor for all expenses and those of any consultants, subcontractors and suppliers, directly or indirectly attributable to the termination. Lost profits shall not be payable. Any such termination shall not give rise to any cause of action for damages against the City.
- (b) <u>Contractor's Duties Upon Termination For Convenience.</u> Upon termination of this Contract without cause, the Contractor shall: (1) immediately stop the Work; (2) stop placing orders and Subcontracts in connection with this Contract; (3) cancel all existing orders and Subcontracts; (4) surrender the site to City in a safe condition; and (5) promptly transfer to City all materials, supplies, work in process, appliances, facilities, equipment and machinery of this Contract, and all work product, plans, drawings, specifications and other information and documents used in connection with Services performed under this Contract. Failure by the Contractor to comply with said duties shall relieve the City of its obligation to compensate the Contractor, as provided for under this section.

### Section 19. INSURANCE

The Contractor shall obtain and maintain in full force and effect the insurance coverage required under Appendix C and shall furnish the City with current certificates of insurance **naming the City of Somerville as a certificate holder.** 

### Section 20. INDEMNIFICATION.

The Contractor shall indemnify, defend, and save harmless the City from and against any and all liabilities, losses, damages, costs, expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees), causes of action, suits, claims, and demands and shall pay any judgment entered against the City on account of personal injuries or damage to property arising out of the work of this Contract.

### Section 21. NOTICES.

Notices shall be in writing, and may be transmitted by mail, federal express, or fax, provided such transmittal is evidenced by a U.S. Mail or Federal Express return receipt or a fax-generated receipt showing the number to which the fax transmission was made:

(a) to the Contractor, at the address set forth in this Agreement or such other address as the Contractor may have designated from time to time in writing, or to FAX #

(b) to the City, addressed to

Notices shall be deemed given when mailed or faxed.

### Section 22. MODIFICATION.

No amendment or modification to this Agreement shall take effect unless it is in writing, signed by all parties.

### Section 23. ASSIGNMENT/SUBCONTRACTING.

The Contractor shall not assign or subcontract this Agreement or any portion of the work without the prior written consent of the City.

### Section 24. GOVERNING LAW.

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the United States of America.

### Section 25. SEVERABILITY.

In the event that any provision of this Agreement is found to be legally unenforceable, the remainder of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

### Section 26. NON-APPLICABILITY OF FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS.

If this section is checked, it means that this contract has not been funded with federal funds and the obligations and requirements under federal law which are set forth in this contract do not apply.

### SPECIAL PROVISIONS

### Completion Date

This contract will be in effect one year from the date of contract award.

### Bonds

A labor and materials bond in the amount of \$25,000 will be required by the successful bidder.

Note: The successful bidder agree that if he is selected as the contractor, he will, within five (5) days, Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays excluded, after presentation thereof by the Awarding Authority, execute a contract in accordance with the terms of this bid and furnish a labor and materials bond from a surety company qualified to do business under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and satisfactory to the Award Authority in the amount stated.

### Insurance

The contractor must provide the following insurance certificates before the contract can be fully executed:

General Liability: \$2,000,000 Automobile: \$2,000,000

Workers' Compensation: as required by General Law

The Certificates of Insurance must show the City of Somerville as the Certificate Holder and as Additional Insured. Should any policies be cancelled before the expiration date, the issuing company must send written notice to the City 30 days prior to cancellation.

### Prevailing Wage Law

Bidders will be required to comply with the Prevailing Wage Laws, M.G.L. c. 149. Every bidder will be required to submit a certified payroll to the City every week. The City will take an active roll in reviewing and monitoring these payrolls weekly. If the City suspects any violations, the City will report them to the Attorney General's Fair Labor and Business Practices Division. The Attorney General's office, after conducting an investigation and a hearing can order the bidder to halt work, if it finds prevailing wage violations. Within fifteen days after completion of its portion of the work, the bidder must submit a Statement of Compliance with the prevailing wage law. The City reserves the right to conduct hearings on bids that are significantly below the average bid price submitted on a project, to make findings of fact, and determinations. Weekly payrolls are public records and the bidder shall make them available upon request. The bidder is required to keep these records for a period of three years from the date of completion of this contract.

### GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

### 1. CONTRACTOR'S OBLIGATION

The Contractor shall and will, in good workmanlike manner, do and perform all work and furnish all supplies and materials, machinery, equipment, facilities and means, except as herein otherwise expressly specified, necessary or proper to perform and complete all the work required by this contract, within the time herein specified, in accordance with the provisions of this contract and said specifications and in accordance with the plans and drawings, and in accordance with the directions of the Design Professional or DPW as given from time to time during the progress of the work. He shall furnish, erect, maintain and remove such construction plant and such temporary works as may be required.

The Contractor shall observe, comply with and be subject to all terms, conditions, requirements and limitations of the contract and specifications, and shall do, carry on and complete the entire work to the satisfaction of the Design Professional and DPW.

### 2. PERFORMANCE/PAYMENT BONDS

The Contractor shall furnish a performance bond in an amount at least equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the contract price as security for the faithful performance of this Contract and also a payment bond in an amount not less than one hundred percent (100%) of the contract price or in a penal sum not less than that prescribed by State, territorial or local law, as security for payment of all persons performing labor on the project under this contract and furnishing materials in connection with this contract. The performance bond and the payment bond may be in one or in separate instruments in accordance with local law, and shall to the extent feasible be in the form developed by the American Institute of Architects (AIA).

### 3. DESIGN PROFESSIONAL'S AUTHORITY

The Design Professional shall give orders and directions contemplated under the contract and specifications, relative to the execution of the work. The Design Professional shall determine the amount, quality, acceptability and fitness of several kinds of work and the construction thereof. The Design Professional's estimates and decisions shall be final and conclusive, except as herein otherwise expressly provided. In case any questions shall arise between the parties hereto relative to said contract or specifications, the determination or decision of the Design Professional shall be a condition precedent to the right of the Contractor to receive any money or payment for work under this contract affected in any manner or to any extent by such question. The Design Professional shall decide the meaning and intent of any portion of the specifications and of any plans or drawings where the same may be found obscure or be in dispute. Any differences or conflicts in regard to their work which may arise between the Contractor under this contract and other Contractors performing work for DPW shall be adjusted and determined by the Design Professional. In accordance with Chapter 30, section 30P of the General Laws the Design Professional's decision on interpretation of the specifications, approval of equipment or material, or any other approval, or progress of the work, shall be made promptly and, in any event, no later than thirty days after a written submission for decision; but if such decision requires extended investigation and study, the Awarding Authority or the Design Professional shall give the party making the submission written notice of the reasons why the decision cannot be made within the thirty day period and the date by which the decision will be made.

### 4. SUBCONTRACTING

- a. The Contractor may utilize the services of specialty subcontractors on those parts of the work which, under normal contracting practices, are performed by specialty subcontractors, subject to the provisions of this section.
- b. The Contractor shall not award any work to any subcontractor without prior written approval of DPW, which approval will not be given until the Contractor submits a written approval statement concerning the proposed award to the subcontractor, which statement shall contain such informations DPW may require. All subcontracts subject to Mass. General laws, Chapter 149, Sections 44A-J, shall comply with the filed sub-bid requirements of that statute.
- c. The Contractor shall be as fully responsible for the acts and omissions of his subcontractors, and of persons either directly or indirectly employed by them, as he is for the acts and omissions of persons directly employed by him.
- d. The Contractor shall cause appropriate provisions to be inserted in all subcontractors relative to the work to bind subcontractors to the Contractor by the Terms of the General Conditions and other contract documents insofar as applicable to the work of subcontractors and to give the Contractor the same power as regards terminating any subcontract that DPW may exercise over the Contractor under any provision of the contract documents.
- e. Nothing contained in this contract shall create any contractual relation between any subcontractor and DPW.

### 5. PERMITS AND CODES

- a. It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to obtain and pay for all permits required in connection with the work. Unless otherwise agreed by the Awarding Authority in writing, the Contractor shall, prior to commencement of the work, (i) meet with the City of Somerville Inspectional Services Department to determine what permits are needed for the work; (ii) obtain all such permits; and (iii) provide copies of such permits to the Awarding Authority. Permits shall include, without limitation, demolition, foundation, digsafe, and building permits; permits for removal, sealing up, or installation of utilities, including gas, electrical, water and sewer; and permits for obstructing public streets and sidewalks.
- b. The Contractor shall comply with all state and local laws, ordinances, and codes. Before installing any work, the Contractor shall examine the Drawings and Technical Specifications for compliance with applicable laws, ordinances, and codes and shall immediately report any discrepancy to OHCD. Where the requirements of the Drawings and Technical Specification fail to comply with applicable laws, ordinances, or codes, OHCD will adjust the Contract by change order to conform to such laws, ordinances or codes (unless waivers in writing covering the differences have been granted by the governing body or department) and make appropriate adjustment in the Contract Price or stipulated unit prices. Should the Contractor fail to observe the foregoing provisions and proceed with the construction, (notwithstanding the fact that such construction is in compliance with the Drawings and Technical Specifications), the Contractor shall remove such work without cost to OHCD, and a change order will be issued to cover only the excess cost that the Contractor would have been entitled to receive if the change had been made before the Contractor commenced work on the items involved.
- c. Notwithstanding the generality of the foregoing, the Contractor shall comply with federal, state and local laws, ordinances, and codes governing the disposal of excavation materials, and debris and rubbish on and off the Project site.

### 6. ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS AND DETAIL DRAWINGS

The Contractor will be furnished additional instructions and detail drawings as necessary to carry out the work included in the contract. The additional drawings and instructions thus supplied to the Contractor will coordinate with the Contract Documents and will be so prepared that they can be reasonably interpreted as part thereof. The Contractor shall carry out the work in accordance with the additional detail drawings and instructions. The Contractor and the Design Professional or DPW will prepare jointly (a) a schedule, fixing the dates at which special detail drawings will be required, such drawings, if any, to be furnished by the Design Professional or DPW in accordance with said schedule, and (b) a schedule fixing the dates for the submission of shop drawings, the beginning of manufacture, testing and installation of materials, supplies and equipment, and the completion of the various parts of the work; each such schedule to be subject to change from time to time in accordance with the progress of the work.

### 7. TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS AND DRAWINGS

Anything mentioned in the Technical Specifications and not shown on the Drawings, or shown on the Drawings and not mentioned in the Technical Specifications, shall be of like effect as if shown on or mentioned in both. In case of any discrepancy in Drawings, or Technical Specifications, the matter shall be immediately submitted to the Designer or DPW for a decision. Said discrepancy shall not be adjusted by the Contractor, save only at his own risk and expense.

### 8. SHOP DRAWINGS

- a. All required shop drawings, machinery, details, layout drawings, etc. shall be submitted to the Designer or DPW for approval sufficiently in advance of requirements to afford ample time for checking, including time for correcting, resubmitting and rechecking if necessary. The Contractor may proceed, only at his own risk and expense, with manufacture or installation of any equipment or work covered by said shop drawings, etc. until they are approved, and no claim by the Contractor for extension of the Contract time will be granted by reason of his failure in this respect.
- b. Any drawings submitted without the Contractor's stamp of approval will not be considered and will be returned to him for proper resubmission. If any drawings show variations from the requirements of the Contract because of standard shop practice or other reason, the Contractor shall make specific mention of such variation in his letter of transmittal in order that, if acceptable, suitable action may be taken for proper adjustment of Contract price and/or time. Otherwise the Contractor will not be relieved of the responsibility for executing the work in accordance with the Contract even though the drawings have been approved.
- c. If a shop drawing is in accord with the Contractor or involves only a minor adjustment in the interest of DPW not involving a change in Contract price or time, the Designer or DPW may approve the drawing. The approval shall be general and shall not relieve the Contractor from his responsibility for adherence to the contract or for any error in the drawing and shall contain in substance the following: "The modification shown on the attached drawing is approved in the interest of DPW to affect an improvement for the Project and is ordered with the understanding that it does not involve any change in the Contract Price or time; that it is subject generally to all Contract stipulation and covenants; and that it is without prejudice to any and all rights of DPW under the Contract and surety bond or bonds."

### 9. MATERIALS AND WORKMANSHIP

- a. Unless otherwise specifically provided for in the Technical Specifications, all workmanship, equipment, materials and articles incorporated in the work shall be new and the best grade of the respective kinds for the purpose. Where equipment, materials, articles or workmanship are referred to in the Technical Specifications as "equal to" any particular standard, the Designer shall decide the question of equality.
- b. The Contractor shall furnish to DPW for approval the manufacturer's detailed specifications for all machinery, mechanical equipment and other equipment articles and materials, together with complete information as to type, performance characteristics, and all other pertinent information. Machinery, mechanical and other equipment, materials or articles installed or used without such prior approval shall be at the risk of subsequent rejections.
- c. Materials specified by reference to the number or symbol of a specific standard, such as an A.S.T.M. Standard, or a Federal Specification or other similar standard, shall comply with requirements in the latest revision thereof and any amendment or supplement thereto in effect on the date of the invitation for Bids, except as limited to type, class or grade, or modified in such reference. The standards referred to, except as modified in the Technical Specifications, shall have full force and effect as though printed therein.
- f. DPW may require the Contractor to dismiss from the work such employee or employees as, DPW or the Designer may deem incompetent, careless, or insubordinate.

### 10. SAMPLES

a. The Contractor shall/promptly submit all material and equipment samples called for in the Contract Documents or required by the Designer or DPW. No such material or equipment shall be manufactured or delivered to the site, except at the Contractor's own risk and expense, until the required samples have been approved in writing by DPW or the Designer. Any delay in the work caused by late or improper submission of samples for approval shall not be considered just cause for an extension of the contract time.

Each sample submitted by the Contractor shall carry a label giving the name of the Contractor, the project for which it is intended, and the name of the producer. The accompanying letter from the Contractor shall state that the sample complies with Contract requirements, shall give the name and brand of the product, its place of origin, the name and address of the producer and all specifications or other detailed information which will assist the Designer in passing upon the acceptability of the sample promptly. It shall also state that all materials or equipment furnished for use in the project will comply with the sample.

- b. Approval of any sample shall be general only and shall not constitute a waiver of DPW's right to demand full compliance with Contract requirements. After actual deliveries, the Designer will have such check tests made as he deems necessary in each instance and may reject materials and equipment for cause, even though such materials and equipment have been given general approval. If materials or equipment which fail to meet check tests have been incorporated in the work, the Designer will have the right to cause their removal and replacement by proper materials and equipment or to demand and secure such reparation by the Contractor as is equitable.
- c. Except as otherwise specifically stated in the Contract, the costs of samples and tests will be as follows:

- The Contractor shall furnish without extra cost, including packing and delivery charges, all samples required for testing purposes, except those samples taken on the Project by the Designer.
- (2) The Contractor shall assume all costs of retesting materials which fail to meet contract requirement.
- (3) The Contractor shall assume all costs of testing materials offered in substitution for those found deficient.

### 11. INSPECTION OF THE WORK

- a. All materials and workmanship shall be subject to inspection, examination, and/or testing by DPW or its designated representative. DPW shall have the right to reject defective material and workmanship and require it to be promptly segregated and removed from the Project Area and replaced with materials and workmanship of specified quality without charge. If the Contractor fails to proceed at once with the correction of rejected materials and workmanship, DPW may proceed to correct the work itself and charge the cost of the same against any monies which may be due the Contractor, without prejudice to any other rights or remedies of DPW.
- b. The Contractor shall furnish promptly all materials reasonably necessary for any tests which may be required. All tests will be performed in such manner as not to delay the work unnecessarily and will be made in accordance with the provisions of the Technical Specifications.
- c. The Contractor shall notify DPW sufficiently in advance of covering or concealing any work in order to permit proper inspection. If any work is covered or concealed without the consent of DPW, the Contractor shall uncover and recover such work for inspection at the contractor's expense, when so requested by DPW. Should it be considered necessary or advisable by DPW to examine work already completed and covered, the Contractor shall on request promptly uncover said work. If such work is found to be defective in any important or essential respect the Contractor shall defray all the expenses of such examination and of satisfactory reconstruction. If, however, such work is found to meet the requirements of the Contract, the actual cost of labor and material necessarily involved in the examination and replacement, plus an additional amount equal to that allowed for change orders shall be allowed the Contractor and he shall, in addition, if completion of the work of the entire Contract has been delayed thereby, be granted a suitable extension of time on account of the additional work involved.
- d. Whenever the quantity justifies it, inspections of work may be made at the place of production, manufacture or shipment, in which case, acceptance shall be final, except as regards (1) latent defects, (2) damage or loss in transit; or (3) fraud or such gross mistakes as amount to fraud. Otherwise, inspections of materials shall take place at the Project Site.
- e. No examination, inspection, or testing, by DPW or its agent shall relieve the Contractor or the Contractor's sureties of liability for defective materials or workmanship.
- f. Any inspection party may include one or more HUD representatives and one or more representatives of each department of the City having jurisdiction over the work being inspected.

### 12. DEDUCTION FOR INCORRECTED WORK

If DPW deems it expedient not to require the Contractor to correct work not done in accordance with the Contract Documents, an equitable deduction from the Contract Price will be made by agreement between the Contractor and DPW. Any dispute regarding such deduction shall be subject to settlement, in case of dispute, as herein provided.

### 13. CONSTRUCTION SUPERINTENDENT

At the site of the work the Contractor shall employ a construction superintendent or foreman who shall have full authority to act for the Contractor. Such representative shall be acceptable to the Design Professional or DPW and shall continue in that capacity for the duration of the job unless he ceases to be on the Contractor's payroll.

### 14. ACCIDENT PREVENTION

- a. The Contractor shall exercise proper precaution at all times for the protection of persons and property and shall be responsible for all damages to persons or property, either on or off the site, which occur as a result of his prosecution of the work. The safety provisions of applicable laws and building and construction codes shall be observed and the Contractor shall take or cause to be taken such additional safety and health measures as DPW may determine to be reasonably necessary. Machinery, equipment and all hazards shall be guarded in accordance with the safety provisions of the "Manual of Accident Prevention in Construction" published by the Associated General Contractors of America, Inc., to the extent that such provisions are not in conflict with applicable local laws.
- b. The Contractor shall indemnify and save harmless DPW from any claims for damages resulting from personal injury and/or death suffered or alleged to have been suffered by any person as a result of any work conducted under this Contract.

### 15. EXISTING UTILITY LINES

Should the Contractor in the execution of his work uncover or discover utility service lines not indicated on the relevant drawings, or that do not show signs of singular service to any existing structures being demolished, the Contractor shall cease work in that area immediately and promptly notify the Public Works Department. Within forty-eight hours, the Public Works Department will inspect the site and issue written instructions to the Contractor. The Contractor shall proceed with only after such written instructions have been received and shall proceed in full compliance with such instructions.

The above mentioned situation or similar circumstances and/or modification if any, shall not relieve the Contractor from his responsibilities in this Contract and also it is without prejudice to any and all rights of DPW covering this said contract and surety or bonds.

### 16. CARE OF WORK

- a. The Contractor shall be responsible for all damages to persons or property that occur as a result of the Contractor's fault or negligence in connection with the prosecution of the work and shall be responsible for the proper care and protection of all materials delivered and work performed until completion and final acceptance by DPW.
- b. The Contractor shall provide sufficient competent watchmen, both day and night, including Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, as necessary, from the time the work is commenced until final

completion and acceptance. Sufficient lighting shall be provided to aid in the prevention of injury to passersby or vandalism to the property or other illegal activities.

- c. In an emergency affecting the safety of life or property, including adjoining property, the Contractor, without special instructions or authorization from DPW is authorized to act at his discretion to prevent such threatened loss or injury, and he shall so act. He shall likewise act if instructed to do so by DPW. Any compensation claimed by the Contractor on account of such emergency work will be determined by DPW as provided in the Section CHANGES IN THE WORK
- d. The Contractor shall avoid damage as a result of its operations to existing sidewalks, streets, curbs, pavements, utilities (except those which are to be replaced or removed), adjoining property, etc. and the Contractor shall at its own expense completely repair any damage thereto caused by its operations.
- e. The Contractor shall shore up, brace, underpin, secure, and protect as may be necessary, all foundations and other parts of existing structure adjacent to, adjoining, and in the vicinity of the site, which may be in any way affected by the excavations or other operations connected with the construction of the improvements embraced in this Contract. The Contractor shall be responsible for the giving of any and all required notices to any adjoining or adjacent property owner or other party before the commencement of work. The Contractor shall indemnify and save harmless the City of Somerville and/or DPW from any liability for damages on account of settlement or the loss of lateral support of adjoining property resulting from the Contractor's failure to comply with this section.

### 17. WEATHER PROTECTION

- a. In the event of temporary suspension of work, during inclement weather, the Contractor will carefully protect and will cause his subcontractors to carefully protect all work and materials against damage or injury from the weather. If, in the opinion of the Design Professional or DPW, any work or materials shall have been damaged or injured by reason of failure on the part of the Contractor or any of his Subcontractors so to protect the work, such work or materials shall be removed and replaced at the expense of the Contractor.
- b. It is the intent of these Specifications to require that, in all Chapter 149, s. 94A contracts, the General Contractor shall provide temporary enclosures and heat to permit construction work to be carried on during the months of November through March in compliance with M.G.L. Chapter 149, Section 44D (G). These Specifications are not to be construed as requiring enclosures or heat for operations that are not economically feasible to protect in the judgment of DPW. Included in the preceding category, without limitation, are such items as site work, excavation, pile driving, steel erection, erection of certain "exterior" wall panels, roofing, and similar operation:
- (1) "WEATHER PROTECTION" shall mean the temporary protection of that work adversely affected by moisture, wind and cold, by covering, enclosing and/or heating. This protection shall provide adequate working areas during the months of November through March as determined by the Design Professional and consistent with the approved construction schedule to permit the continuous progress of all work necessary to maintain an orderly and efficient sequence of construction operations. The General Contractor shall furnish and install all "Weather Protection" material and be responsible for all costs, including heating required to maintain a minimum temperature of 40 degrees F, at the working surface. This provision does not supersede any specific requirements for methods of construction, curing of materials or the applicable General

Conditions set forth in the Contract Articles with added regard to performance obligations of the Contractor

- (2) Within 30 calendar days after his award of contract, the General Contractor shall submit in writing to DPW for approval, three copies of his proposed methods for "Weather Protection".
- (3) Installation of weather protection and heating devices shall comply with all safety regulations including provisions for adequate ventilation and fire protection devices. Heating devices which may cause damage to finish surfaces shall not be used.
- (4) The General Contractor shall furnish and install one accurate Fahrenheit thermometer at each work area as designated by the Designer. However, one additional accurate Fahrenheit thermometer shall be provided for every 2,000 square feet of floor space where the work areas exceed 2,000 square feet.

### 18. SANITARY FACILITIES

The Contractor shall furnish, install and/or maintain ample sanitary facilities for the workmen. As the needs arise, a sufficient number of enclosed temporary toilets shall be conveniently placed as required by the sanitary codes of the State and Local Government. Drinking water shall be provided from an approved source, so piped or transported as to keep it safe and fresh and served from single service containers or satisfactory types of sanitary drinking stands or fountains. All such facilities and services shall be furnished in strict accordance with existing and governing health regulations. Nothing in this Section shall be construed as forbidding the use of facilities available in existing buildings on the job site if they meet the above requirements and the use of them will not interfere with the progress of the work.

### 19. USE OF PREMISES AND REMOVAL OF DEBRIS

The Contractor expressly undertakes at his own expense:

- a. to store his apparatus, materials, supplies and equipment in such orderly fashion at the site of the work as will not unduly interfere with the progress of his work or the work of any other contractors;
- b. to place upon the work or any part thereof, only such loads as are consistent with the safety of that portion of the work.
- c. to clean up frequently all refuse, rubbish, scrap materials and debris caused by his operations, to the end that at all times the site of the work shall present a neat, orderly and workmanlike appearance.
- d. before final payment to remove all surplus material, false work, temporary structure, including foundations thereof, plant of any description and debris of every nature resulting from this operations, and to put the site in a neat, orderly condition.
- e. to effect all cutting, fitting or patching of his work required to make the same to conform
  to the plans and specifications and, except with the consent of the Design Professional or
  DPW not to cut or otherwise work of any other contractor.

### 20. COORDINATION WITH OTHER CONTRACTORS

The Contractor shall coordinate his operations with those of other Contractors. Cooperation will be required in the arrangement for the storage of materials and in the detailed execution of work. The Contractor, including his subcontractors, shall keep informed of the progress and the detail work of other Contractors and shall notify the Design Professional or DPW immediately of lack of progress or defective workmanship on the part of other Contractors. Failure of a contractor to keep informed of the work progressing on the site and failure to give notice of lack of progress of defective workmanship by others shall be construed as acceptance by him of the status of the work as being satisfactory for proper coordination with his own work.

### 21. QUANTITIES OR ESTIMATES

Wherever the estimated quantities of work to be done and materials to be furnished under this contract are shown in any of the documents including the proposal, they are given for use in comparing bids and the right is especially reserved herein otherwise specifically limited, to increase or diminish them as may be deemed reasonably necessary or desirable by DPW to complete the work contemplated by the contract, nor shall any such increases or diminution shall in no way violate this contract, nor shall any such increase or diminution give cause for claims or liability for damages.

### 22. DISPUTES

- a. All disputes arising under this Contract or its interpretation, whether involving law of fact or both, or extra work, and all claims for alleged breach of Contract shall within ten (10) days of commencement of the dispute be presented by the Contractor to DPW for decision. All papers pertaining to claims shall state the facts surrounding the claims in sufficient detail to identify the claim, with its character and scope. In the meantime, the Contractor shall proceed with the work as directed. Any claim not presented within the time limit specified in this paragraph shall be deemed to have been waived, except that if the claim is of a continuing character and notice of the claim is not given within ten (10) days of its commencement, the claim will be considered only for a period commencing ten (10) days prior to the receipt by DPW of notice thereof.
- b. The Contractor shall submit proof of the Contractor's claim in detail. Each decision by DPW will be in writing and will be mailed to the Contractor by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested.
- c. If the Contractor does not agree with DPW's decision the Contractor shall not delay the work, but shall notify DPW promptly that he is proceeding with the work under protest and he may then except the matter in question from the final release.

### 23. LAND AND RIGHTS-OF-WAY

Prior to the start of construction, DPW shall obtain all lands and rights-of-way necessary for the carrying out and completion of work to be performed under this contract.

### 24. WARRANTY OF TITLE

No material, supplies, or equipment to be installed as part of the work shall be purchased subject to any chattel mortgage or under a conditional sale or other agreement by which an interest therein or in any part thereof is retained by the seller or supplier. The Contractor shall warrant good title to

all materials, supplies, and equipment installed or incorporated in the work and, upon completion of all work, shall deliver the same to DPW free from any claims, liens, or charges. Neither the Contractor nor any person, furnishing any material or labor for any work covered by this Contract shall have any right to a lien. Nothing contained in this paragraph, however, shall defeat or impair the right of persons furnishing materials or labor to recover under any bond given by the Contractor for their protection, or to recover under any laws permitting such persons to look to funds due the Contractor in the hands of DPW. The provisions of this paragraph shall be given to all persons furnishing materials for the work when no formal contract is entered into for such materials.

### 25. GENERAL GUARANTY

Neither the final certificate of payment nor any provision in the Contract Documents, nor partial or entire occupancy of the premises by DPW shall constitute any acceptance of work not done in accordance with the Contract Documents or relieve the Contractor of liability in respect to any express warranties or responsibility for faulty materials or workmanship. The Contractor shall remedy any defects in the work and pay for any damage to other work resulting therefrom, which shall appear within a period of one year from the date of final acceptance of the work unless a longer period is specified. DPW will give notice of observed defects with reasonable promptness.

### 26. REVIEW OF RECORDS

DPW, its authorized representative and agents and the HUD Representative for the Secretary shall, at all times have access to and be permitted to observe and review all work materials, equipment, payrolls, personnel records, employment conditions, material invoices, and other relevant data and records pertaining to this Contract, provided, however, that all instructions and approval with respect to the work will be given to the Contractor only by DPW through its authorized representatives or agents.



### NOTICE TO ALL EMPLOYEES REGARDING PAYMENT OF LIVING WAGE

Under the Somerville, Massachusetts' Living Wage Ordinance (Ordinance No. 1991-1), any person or entity who has entered into a contract with the City of Somerville is required to pay its employees who are involved in providing services to the City of Somerville no less than a "Living Wage". The Living Wage as of July 1, 2005 is \$10.17 per hour. The only employees who are not covered by the Living Wage Ordinance are individuals in a Youth Program. "Youth Program" as defined in the Ordinance, "means any city, state or federally funded program which employs youth, as defined by city, state or federal guidelines, during the summer, or as part of a school to work program, or in any other related seasonal or part-time program."

For assistance and information regarding the protections and obligations provided for in the Living Wage Ordinance and/or a copy of the Living Wage Ordinance, all employees should contact the City of Somerville's Purchasing Department directly.

### SOMERVILLE LIVING WAGE ORDINANCE FORM

(Ordinance No. 1999-1\*)

This form shall be included in all Invitations for Bids and Requests for Proposals which involve the furnishing of labor, time or effort (with no end product other than reports) by vendors contracting or subcontracting with the City of Somerville, where the contract price meets or exceeds the following dollar thresholds:

- \$50,000 for contracts commencing during the period 7-1-99 to 6-30-01 (Fiscal Years 2000 and 2001);
- \$30,000 for contracts commencing during the period 7-1-01 to 6-30-03 (Fiscal Years 2002 and 2003); and
- \$10,000 for contracts commencing during the period 7-1-03 and thereafter (Fiscal Years 2004 and thereafter.):

The purpose of this form is to ensure that such vendors pay a "Living Wage" (defined below) to all covered employees (i.e., all employees except individuals in a city, state or federally funded youth program). In the case of bids, the City will award the contract to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder paying a Living Wage. In the case of RFP's, the City will select the most advantageous proposal from a responsive and responsible offeror paying a Living Wage. In neither case, however, shall the City be under any obligation to select a bid or proposal that exceeds the funds available for the contract.

<u>Definition of "Living Wage"</u> For this contract or subcontract, as of 07-01-2005 "Living Wage" shall be deemed to be an hourly wage of no less that \$10.17/hour. From time to time, the Living Wage may be upwardly adjusted and amendments, if any, to the contract or subcontract may require the payment of a higher hourly rate if a higher rate is then in effect.

If the undersigned bidder or offeror is selected, this form will be attached to the contract or subcontract and the certifications made herein shall be incorporated as part of such contract or subcontract.

### CERTIFICATIONS

- The undersigned shall pay no less than the Living Wage to all covered employees
  who directly expend their time on the contract or subcontract with the City of
  Somerville.
- 2. The undersigned shall post a notice, (copy enclosed), to be furnished by the contracting City Department, informing covered employees of the protections and obligations provided for in the Somerville Living Wage Ordinance, and that for assistance and information, including copies of the Ordinance, employees should contact the contracting City Department. Such notice shall

be posted in each location where services are performed by covered employees, in a conspicuous place where notices to employees are customarily posted.

- 3. The undersigned shall maintain payrolls for all covered employees and basic records relating hereto and shall preserve them for a period of three years. The records shall contain the name and address of each employee, the number of hours worked, the gross wages, a copy of the social security returns, and evidence of payment thereof and such other data as may be required by the contracting City Department from time to time.
- 4. The undersigned shall submit payroll records to the City upon request and, if the City receives information of possible noncompliance with the provisions the Somerville Living Wage Ordinance, the undersigned shall permit City representatives to observe work being performed at the work site, to interview employees, and to examine the books and records relating to the payrolls being investigated to determine payment of wages.
- The undersigned shall not fund wage increases required by the Somerville Living Wage Ordinance by reducing the health insurance benefits of any of its employees.
- 6. The undersigned agrees that the penalties and relief set forth in the Somerville Living Wage Ordinance shall be in addition to the rights and remedies set forth in the contract an/or subcontract
