SECTION 2.0 SPECIFICATIONS/SCOPE OF SERVICES

1.1 Introduction

The City of Somerville is seeking proposals from qualified consultants to develop a Historic Preservation Plan, which will build on the City's 2010 Comprehensive Plan, <u>SomerVision</u>, and guide the City in its allocation of <u>Community Preservation Act</u> (CPA) funding.

This Request for Proposal (RFP) stipulates the procedures and requirements to be used by the City in its selection of consulting services. The project should begin no later than Monday, November 3, 2014 and should be completed by Wednesday, May 6, 2015. The City has established a budget not to exceed \$20,000.

This effort will be funded and administered by the Community Preservation Committee (CPC). The Community Preservation Act Manager will serve as the project coordinator, providing administrative support to the consultant and serving as a liaison between the consultant and the City's Historic Preservation Commission and staff. The City is currently seeking an intern to assist the consultant with certain aspects of the plan. The intern will report to the Community Preservation Act Manager, but his/her tasks and deliverables will be determined with the consultant.

The City will evaluate all timely proposals to ensure that all required submittals have been included in the responses and that all responses meet the Quality Requirements. Proposals that are determined to be complete will be presented to a Selection Committee consisting of the City's CPA Manager, a representative from the City's Historic Preservation staff, a member of the Somerville CPC, and a member of the Somerville Historic Preservation Commission. The Committee will review and rate all qualifying proposals using the Comparative Evaluation Criteria and interview all qualifying proposers. Activities will commence immediately upon issuance of a Notice to Proceed.

1.2 Background

The City of Somerville passed the Community Preservation Act in November 2012, creating a new funding stream of at least \$1.5 million per year for historic resources, affordable housing, and open space and recreation projects. The CPA defines a historic resource as a "building, structure, vessel, real property, document or artifact listed on the state register of historic places or determined by the local historic preservation commission to be significant in the history, archeology, architecture, or culture of the city or town."

The Community Preservation Committee was established in 2014 and is responsible for making

recommendations to the City's legislative body for distributing these funds to applicants. The Committee will base these recommendations on priorities established in its Community Preservation Plan, which was heavily informed by the City's existing planning documents, including SomerVision, the Open Space and Recreation Plan, and the Housing Needs Assessment. The City of Somerville does not have a Historic Preservation Plan, however, so the Committee lacks a comprehensive resource to guide its prioritization of historic resources projects and initiatives.

The Committee therefore seeks a qualified consultant to prepare a data-driven and action-oriented Historic Preservation Plan to inform the City about its historic resources, improve the preservation of these resources, and guide the allocation of CPA funding for historic resources.

2.2 Scope of Work

The selected vendor will provide consulting services to the City of Somerville, culminating in the creation of a comprehensive Historic Preservation Plan that builds on the City's existing planning documents, including SomerVision. The Plan should include the following or similar sections, not necessarily in this order:

- 1. **Executive Summary**: summarizes the key findings and recommendations in the plan.
- 2. **History of Somerville**: briefly describes the pre-historic and historic development of the City.
- 3. **History of Planning in Somerville**: briefly describes the City's other planning documents and summarizes their discussion, if any, of historic preservation.
- 4. **Summary of Historic Preservation in Somerville**: discusses the role of the Historic Preservation Commission; summarizes and quantifies the City's historic preservation efforts to date, including but not limited to local historic districts, easements, and National Register properties; describes the historic resources the City has lost, historic resources the City still has, and historic resources that are at risk; describes how the City can better protect its historic resources.
- 5. **Inventory**: describes what an inventory is; describes which properties currently have inventory forms, which inventory forms need to be updated, and which properties need to be documented on inventory forms; recommends a realistic and efficient strategy for developing a broad understanding of the City's historic resources by neighborhood.
- 6. **National Register**: describes the National Register of Historic Places; includes what is currently listed on the National Register of Historic Places and what may be eligible for listing; explains investment tax credits and applicable grant programs.
- 7. **Public Perception**: investigates how Somerville residents feel about the City's historic resources. For example, do they appreciate the existing historic properties? Are there

efforts that can help newcomers appreciate Somerville's historic resources? If Somerville's historic resources are not well-protected, do residents understand how vulnerable they are to loss? Do they understand what can happen to the City's historic resources under current zoning?

- 8. **Municipal Regulations**: reviews the existing municipal regulations that impact historic preservation including but not limited to zoning, local historic districts, demolition delay, minimum maintenance regulations, subdivision regulations, signage regulations, and site plan review; recommends changes to existing regulations or additional bylaws that could help to protect historic resources.
- 9. Municipal Policy, Management, and Capital Improvements: includes a list of all historic municipally owned properties such as school buildings, libraries, or parks; assesses their historic significance and architectural quality; describes current management practices and whether changes should be made to better protect these resources; investigates future capital improvement projects such as transportation projects, new municipal buildings, and sewer line extensions for their impact on historic resources.
- 10. **Action Plan**: outlines a realistic year-by-year schedule for implementing all of the above recommendations, including the name of the organization or board responsible for implementation; could include ongoing and long-term goals.

Wherever appropriate, the consultant should use maps, charts, tables, photographs, and illustrations to convey information. The formatting of the Plan should be consistent with other City planning documents.

2.3 Specifications / Requirements

The consultant has six months to complete the Historic Preservation Plan, from November 3, 2014 through May 6, 2015. The consultant will meet with the CPA Manager and a representative from the City's Historic Preservation staff for a start-up meeting prior to the commencement of the project and to review project progress and deliverables four times throughout the project in early January and at the end of February, March, and April. The start-up and interim meetings will take place at Somerville City Hall unless another location is agreed upon. Suggested tasks to be completed in each of four phases and required deliverables due at the end of each phase are described below. See Section 2.14 for more detail on the deliverables.

Phase 1 (November and December 2014)

Tasks:

- 1. Review recent historic preservation plans for potential models.
- 2. Meet with the Community Preservation Commission at its regularly scheduled meeting on November 5, 2014.

- 3. Meet with the Somerville Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) at its regularly scheduled meeting on November 18, 2014.
- 4. Review the historical development of Somerville (e.g., settlement patterns, architecture, demography, transportation, industry, housing, and commerce).
- 5. Review past planning efforts in the City (including comprehensive plans, economic development plans, capital improvement plans, and open space plans) for preservation discussion, issues, and recommendations.
- 6. Review history of historic preservation planning in Somerville, including the work of the HPC and other relevant non-profit organizations like the Somerville Museum.
- 7. Review relevant City ordinances, such as the demolition review ordinance and the zoning code, for their impacts on Somerville's historic resources.
- 8. Review relevant state and federal regulations and policies for their impact on Somerville's historic resources.
- 9. Assess the historic significance and architectural quality of municipally owned buildings.
- 10. Create a system for evaluating existing survey forms, including criteria to rank each as excellent, fair, or poor.

Deliverables:

- 1. Draft table of contents for the historic preservation plan, including preliminary list of maps, charts, tables, and illustrations
- 2. Draft History of Somerville section (or similar)
- 3. Draft History of Planning in Somerville section (or similar)
- 4. Draft Summary of Historic Preservation in Somerville section (or similar)
- 5. Draft criteria for survey evaluation system

Phase 2 (January and February 2015)

Tasks:

- 1. Meet with project coordinator to review November and December tasks completed and deliverables in early January.
- 2. Catalogue, review, and assess Somerville's existing survey forms using system established in September.
- 3. Catalogue and review existing National Register listed properties.
- 4. Catalogue and review existing easements.
- 5. Conduct site visits
- 6. Develop draft survey recommendations including updating inventory forms and additional survey needs.
- 7. Develop draft recommendations for National Register eligible properties.

- 8. Prepare for interactive public meeting.
- 9. Meet with project coordinator to review tasks completed and deliverables at the end of February.

Deliverables:

- 1. Draft Inventory section (or similar)
- 2. Draft National Register section (or similar)
- 3. Working concept for public meeting

Phase 3 (March 2015)

Tasks:

- 1. Hold interactive public meeting to share history and current state of historic preservation in Somerville and to gather feedback on residents' thoughts about Somerville's historic resources.
- 2. Review successful and/or innovative historic preservation efforts in other communities, including programs to support the preservation of privately owned historic buildings and homes.
- 3. Develop draft recommendations for amending current or creating new municipal regulations pertinent to historic preservation.
- 4. Develop draft recommendations on effective uses of CPA funding.
- 5. Prepare other necessary recommendations based on additional information gathered.
- 6. Prepare other necessary recommendations and develop five-year action plan that identifies each agent responsible for implementation of tasks and a schedule for implementation.
- 7. Meet with project coordinator to review tasks completed and deliverables at the end of March.

Deliverables:

- 1. Draft Public Perception section (or similar)
- 2. Draft Municipal Regulations section (or similar)
- 3. Draft Municipal Policy, Management, and Capital Improvements section (or similar)
- 4. Draft Action Plan section (or similar)

2.3.1 Proposal requirements

 - a. The identity and background of the individual, partnership, or corporation applying for contract award
 - b. Credentials of the project personnel, their managers, and the nature of the supervision
 - c. Responsibilities of each of the project personnel
 - d. Sub-contractors, if the consultant intends to sub-contract any work required in the scope of services
 - e. Sample work products for all personnel.
- 2. An applicant qualifications statement, including:
 - a. Professional qualifications and work experience attesting to capacity to perform the required work program.
 - b. Resumes for all project personnel.
- 3. A detailed explanation of the proposer's approach to this project, including
 - a. Methodology
 - b. Proposer's expectations of assistance and services from the City
 - c. Technical work plan and project timeline for accomplishing the tasks described in Section 2.3
- 4. A client reference list, with names, addresses, telephone numbers, and e-mail addresses (if available) especially for clients for whom the proposer has performed similar services within the past five years

2.4 Quality Requirements

The following quality requirements, or basic business requirements, are the minimum set of standards that an entity must meet and certify to be considered responsible and responsive. The City of Somerville will disqualify any response that does not meet the minimum quality

requirements. A "No Response" to items 1, 2 or 3, or a failure to respond to any of the following minimum standards will result in disqualification of your bid.

2.8 Vendor Conduct

The Vendor's employees shall comply with all City regulations, policies and procedures. The vendor shall ensure that their employees present professional work attire at all times. The authorized contracting body of the City may at his/her sole discretion, to the right the vendor to remove any and vendor employee from city facilities for misconduct or safety reasons. Such rule does not relieve the vendor of their responsibility to provide sufficient and timely service. The City will provide the vendor with immediate written rationale notice for removal of employee through the Purchasing Department.

SECTION 6.0 INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFEROR

6.1 General Information & Submission Instructions

6.1.1 Bid Delivery

Responses must be delivered by 9/30/2014 at 11:am EST to City of Somerville, Purchasing Department, Attn: Michael Richards, 93 Highland Avenue, Somerville, MA 02143. One (1) copy of the response should be submitted. Responses must be sealed and marked with the solicitation tile and number. All bids must include a forms listed in the Proposers Checklist

Technical proposals and price proposals must be delivered in separate, sealed envelopes.

6.1.2 Evaluation Methodology

All responses will be reviewed by an evaluation committee composed of employees of the City. However, the City reserves the right to involve an outside consultant in the selection process. Final selection will be based upon the evaluators' analysis of the information and materials provided by the proposing vendors in their technical submissions compared to both the Quality Requirements & Comparative Evaluation Criteria of the solicitation. Responses that meet the minimum Quality Requirements will then be reviewed for responses to the Comparative Evaluation Criteria. The evaluation committee will assign a rating of Highly Advantageous, Advantageous, Not Advantageous or Unacceptable to the Comparative Evaluation Criteria.

The City will award the contract to the most responsive and responsible Offeror who demonstrates best value to the city, technical and price considered. Before awarding the contract(s), the City may request additional information from the Offeror to insure that the Offeror has the necessary resources to perform the required services. The City reserves the right to reject any and all proposals if it determines that the criteria set forth have not been met.

6.2 Non-Price (Technical) Proposal Format

Responses must be submitted in accordance with the requirements set forth in this solicitation. These requirements were developed to standardize the preparation of responses while helping to assure consistency in format and content. This process will reduce the time required to prepare a response and will simplify the review process by City staff. Results of the proposal review process will be utilized to establish a preliminary ranking of the proposers. The City may interview the top ranked candidates as part of the evaluation process. All information in the technical proposal should be organized and presented as directed below. Your Non-Price Proposal response should contain all forms outlined in the Proposers Checklist in the order that they appear.

Responses shall be prepared on standard 8.5 x 11 inch paper (charts may be landscaped but must

be on 8.5 x 11 inch paper) and shall be in a legible font size (12). All pages of each response shall be appropriately numbered, and identified with the solicitation number. For ease of reference, consecutive page numbering with tabs is required.

Elaborate format and binding are neither necessary nor desirable. All binders will be capable of lying flat when opened. 6.3 Price Proposal Format

6.3.1 Cover Letter

6.3.2 Price Summary Page

6.3.4 Price Submission

6.3.5 Estimated Quantities

The City of Somerville has provided estimated quantities for services over the course of the contract period. These estimates are estimates only and not guaranteed.

6.4 Bid Signature

A response must be signed as follows: 1) if the Offeror is an individual, by her/him personally; 2) if the Offeror is a partnership, by the name of the partnership, followed by the signature of each general partner; and 3) if the Offeror is a corporation, by the authorized officer, whose signature must be attested to by the clerk/secretary of the corporation, and with the corporate seal affixed.

6.5 Time for Bid Acceptance

The contract will be awarded within 60 days after the bid opening. The time for award may be extended for up to 45 additional days by mutual agreement between the City of Somerville and the apparent lowest responsive and responsible bidder (or, for a contract requiring payment, the apparent highest responsive and responsible bidder.)

The Offeror's submission will remain in effect for a period of 90 days from the response deadline or until it is formally withdrawn, a contract is executed or this solicitation is canceled, whichever occurs first.

6.6 Hours of Operation

If the awarded Vendor for their convenience desires to perform work during other than normal working hours or on other than normal work days, or if the Vendor is required to perform work at such times, the Vendor shall reimburse the City for any additional expense occasioned the City, thereby, such as, but not limited to, overtime pay for City employees, utilities service, etc.

submitted in a sealed envelope clearly labeled "Modification No.__" to the address listed in part one of this section. Each modification must be numbered in sequence, and must reference the original solicitation.

After the bid opening, an Offeror may not change any provision of the bid in a manner prejudicial to the interests of the City or fair competition. Minor informalities will be waived or the bidder will be allowed to correct them. If a mistake and the intended bid are clearly evident on the face of the bid document, the mistake will be corrected to reflect the intended correct bid, and the bidder will be notified in writing; the bidder may not withdraw the bid. 6.12 Warranty

SECTION 7.0 GENERAL TERMS & CONDITIONS

7.1 Taxes

Purchases incurred by the City are exempt from Federal Excise Taxes, Massachusetts Sales Tax, and solicitation prices must exclude any such taxes. Tax Exemption Certificates will be furnished upon request. City of Somerville's Massachusetts Tax Exempt Number is M046 001 414.

7.2 Freight on Board (FOB)

All prices are to be firm F.O.B. delivered destination (Somerville, MA), to the address specified on the "Notice to Proposers" or any other department location doing business for the City of Somerville in need of such services.

7.3 Unit Price

In case of error in extension of prices quoted herein, the unit price will govern.

7.4 Price Reduction

It is understood and agreed that should any price reductions occur between the opening of this RFP and completion of this delivery. The benefits of all such reductions will be extended.

7.5 Guarantees

The proposer to whom a contract is awarded, guarantees to the City of Somerville all supplies, equipment, related services/maintenance, and labor for a period of at least one (1) year. <u>Upon inspection</u>, any defective or inferior equipment, supplies/materials shall be replaced without additional cost to the City. The contractor will assume any additional cost accrued by the City.

7.6 Indemnification

The vendor agrees to take all necessary precautions to prevent injury to any persons or damage to property during the term of this agreement and shall indemnify and save the City of Somerville harmless against all loss and expense resulting in any way, from any negligent or willful act or omission on the part of the Vendor, it's agents, employees, or sub-contractors or resulting directly or indirectly from Vendor's performance under this Agreement.

7.7 Insurance

Vendor's liability insurance shall be purchased and maintained by the Vendor to protect him from claims under Worker's Compensation Acts and other employee benefits acts, claims from damages because of bodily injury, including death, and from claims for damages, other than to the work itself, to property which may arise out of or result from the Vendor's operation under this agreement, whether such operation by himself or anyone employed by them. This insurance shall be written for not less than any limits of law, whichever is the greater and shall include

contractual liability applicable to Vendor's obligations. The Vendor shall deposit with the City of Somerville standard certificates of insurance thereof for any insurance about to expire at least ten (10) days before such expiration. All such insurance policies shall contain an endorsement or provision requiring thirty (30) days written notice to the City of Somerville prior to cancellations or material change in coverage, scope, or amount of any such policy or policies. Compliance by Vendor with the insurance requirement, however, shall not relieve Vendor from liability under the indemnity provisions. Vendor shall require subcontractors to provide and maintain the required insurance at subcontractors' expense. 7.8 Independent Contractor

Vendor is not an agent or employee of the City of Somerville and is not authorized to act on behalf of the City of Somerville.

7.9 Complete Agreement

This agreement supersedes all prior agreements and understandings between the parties and may not be changed unless mutually agreed upon in writing by both parties.

7.10 Assignment

Vendor shall not assign the Agreement, or any interest therein, without prior written consent of the City of Somerville.

7.11 Subcontractors

Vendor shall not engage any other company, sub-contractor or individual to perform any obligation hereunder, without the prior written consent of the City of Somerville.

7.12 Governing Law

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

7.13 Enforceability

In the event any provision of this Agreement is found to be legally unenforceable, such unenforceability shall not prevent enforcement of any other provision of the Agreement.

7.14 Conflict of Interest

The Proposer certifies that no official or employee of the City of Somerville has a financial interest in this proposal or in the contract which the proposer offers to execute or in the expected profits to arise there from, unless there has been compliance with provisions of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 43, sec. 27 (Interest in Public Contract by Public Employees), and Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 268A, sec. 20 (Conflict of Interest), and that this proposal is made in good faith without fraud or collusion or connection with any other person submitting a proposal.

7.15 Termination

7.15.1 For Cause

The City of Somerville shall have the right to terminate this agreement if (i) Vendor neglects or fails to perform or observe any of these obligations hereunder and a cure is not affected by Vendor within fifteen (15) days next following its receipt of a termination notice issued by the City of Somerville, or (ii) if a judgment or decree is entered against Vendor approving a petition for any arrangement, liquidations, dissolution or similar relief relating to bankruptcy or insolvency and such judgment or decree remains unvacated for thirty (30) days; or (iii) immediately if Vendor shall file a voluntary petition in bankruptcy or any petition or answer seeking any arrangement, liquidation or dissolution relating to bankruptcy, insolvency or other relief or debtors shall seek or consent or acquiesce an appointment of any trustee, receiver of liquidation of any of Vendor's property; or (iv) funds are not appropriated or otherwise made available to support continuation of performance in any fiscal year succeeding the first year of this Agreement. The City of Somerville shall pay all reasonable and supportable costs incurred prior to termination, which payment shall not exceed the value of service provided.

7.15.2 Termination for Convenience

The City may terminate this Contract without cause, at any time, effective upon the date of termination specified by written notice to the Contractor, in which case, the Contractor shall be compensated for: (1) sums due under this Contract incurred up to the date of termination for all Work performed and accepted by the City up to the termination date, calculated on a percentage completion basis covering the period of time between the last approved application for payment and the date of termination using the progress schedule and schedule of values. The Contractor shall use its best efforts to mitigate any expenses and shall in no event incur any new obligations after the date of termination.

7.15.3 Payment by the City

Payment by the City as provided in this section shall be deemed to fully compensate the Contractor for all expenses and those of any consultants, subcontractors and suppliers, directly or indirectly attributable to the termination. Lost profits shall not be payable. Any such termination shall not give rise to any cause of action for damages against the City.

7.15.4 Contractor's Duties Upon Termination For Convenience

Upon termination of this Contract without cause, the Contractor shall: (1) immediately stop the Work; (2) stop placing orders and Subcontracts in connection with this Contract; (3) cancel all existing orders and Subcontracts; (4) surrender the site to City in a safe condition; and (5) promptly transfer to City all materials, supplies, work in process, appliances, facilities, equipment

and machinery of this Contract, and all work product, plans, drawings, specifications and other information and documents used in connection with Services performed under this Contract. Failure by the Contractor to comply with said duties shall relieve the City of its obligation to compensate the Contractor, as provided for under this section.

7.16 Discrimination

It is understood and agreed that it shall be a material breach of any contract resulting from this RFP for the contractor to engage in any practice which shall violate any provision of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 151B, relative to discrimination in hiring, discharge, compensation, or terms, conditions or privileges of employment because of race, color, religion, creed, national origin, sex, or ancestry.

7.17 Withdrawal or Modification of Bid Response

To withdraw, cancel or modify a response at any time prior to the solicitation opening date, an Offeror must submit such request in writing to the Purchasing Director. Correction or modifications must be sealed when submitted and must indicate on the outside of the envelope whether the correction or modification pertains to the price proposal or the non-price proposal.

7.18 Samples

All qualified proposers may be requested to submit samples.

7.19 Financial and Operational Information

By submitting a proposal, the proposer authorized the City of Somerville to contact any and all parties referenced by the proposer regarding financial and operational information.

7.20 Payment

The City of Somerville shall make no payment for a supply or service rendered prior to the execution of the contract.

7.21 Extension of Contract

The City reserves the right to extend the time of any contract resulting from the bid as needed and/or to increase the value by 25% at the sole discretion of the Purchasing Director.

- a. The Offeror's submission will remain in effect for a period of 90 days from the response deadline or until it is formally withdrawn, a contract is executed or this solicitation is canceled, whichever occurs first.
- b. The City will have the option to cancel the contract provided that written notice is given 90 days prior to the effective termination date.

The Procurement Officer shall cancel the contract if funds are not appropriated or otherwise made available to support continuation of performance in any fiscal year succeeding the first year.

NOW THEREFORE, the City and the Vendor in consideration of mutual covenants herein contained and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, agree as follows:

ARTICLE I. VENDOR'S SERVICES/SUPPLIES

The Vendor shall provide the Services and/or Supplies described in **Appendix C**, Scope of Services/Specifications, attached and made part hereof.

ARTICLE II. TERM AND/OR DELIVERY

A. Term.

- 1. The term of this Contract shall commence on the day and year first written above.
- 2. The Vendor shall complete the Services and/or furnish the supplies, by contract end date (the" Completion Date"). If this Contract is for Supplies, the Vendor agrees to deliver the Supplies upon receipt of an approved Purchase Order.
- 3. The term of this Contract may be extended at the sole discretion of the City, through written notice to the Vendor.

ARTICLE IV. DEFAULT; TERMINATION; REMEDIES

A. Events of Default.

The following shall constitute events of default under this Contract:

- 1. The Vendor has made any material misrepresentation to the City; or
- 2. A judgment or decree is entered against the Vendor approving a petition for an arrangement, liquidation, dissolution or similar relief relating to bankruptcy or insolvency; or
